Immediately after the closing of the polls, the election officers proceeded forthwith to count the votes recorded on the voting machines without delay or adjournment. The proposal or proposals voted upon were set forth in full in the ballots and are the identical proposal or respective proposals stated in the notice of said meeting as préviously posted and published.
