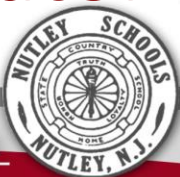

- **Eight Core Elements with Indicators**
- **Rubric (41 pages) with Rating Categories, Criteria with Sample Documentation**
- **Rating Categories Scale 0-3**
 - 0 = Does Not Meet the Requirements**
 - 1 = Partially Meets the Requirements**
 - 2 = Meets All Requirements**
 - 3 = Exceeds All Requirements**
- **Sufficient Documentation must be maintained to substantiate ratings for each indicator.**



➤ **Core Element #1: HIB Programs, Approaches or Other Initiatives**

5 Indicators:

- Established, implemented and assessed programs, approaches, initiatives;
- Programs, approaches or other initiatives prevented and addressed HIB;
- SST/SCT identified patterns of HIB and reviewed school climate for prevention of HIB

➤ **Core Element #2: Training on the BOE – approved HIB Policy & Procedures**

3 Indicators:

- Employees provided training on the HIB policy;
- Training included instruction on preventing HIB on the basis of protected characteristics;
- HIB policy discussed with students

➤ **Core Element #3: Other Staff Instruction and Training Programs**

5 Indicators:

- Instruction in suicide prevention that included info on HIB in 5 year PD period;
- Instruction on HIB prevention;
- ABS provided time to participate in in-service training;
- SST/SCT were provided with professional development;
- School leaders received information on the prevention of HIB



➤ **Core Element #4: Curriculum and Instruction on HIB and Related Information and Skills**

2 Indicators:

- Ongoing, age-appropriate instruction on preventing HIB according to NJ Student Learning Standards;
- Observed the Week of Respect

➤ **Core Element #5: HIB Personnel**

3 Indicators:

- Principal appointed a school ABS;
- ABS met with ABC at least 2x per year;
- SST/SCT met at least 2x per year

➤ **Core Element #6: School-Level HIB Incident Reporting Procedure**

2 Indicators:

- Implemented district's procedure for reporting HIB;
- Implemented district's procedure for reporting new information on a prior HIB



➤ **Core Element #7: HIB Investigation Procedure**

4 Indicators:

- Notification to parents;
- Completion of the investigation within 10 school days of the written incident report;
- Preparation of written report on the findings of each investigation;
- Results of investigation to superintendent within 2 school days of completed investigation.

➤ **Core Element #8: HIB Reporting**

2 Indicators:

- Procedure for ensuring staff member reports (verbal & written) include required information for incidents of HIB, violence and vandalism;
- Official grades from DOE are posted on each school's homepage.

Core Element #2: Training on the BOE HIB Policy & Procedures

- * Parent training

Core Element #3: Other Staff Instruction and Training Programs

- * Increase professional development opportunities for SST/SCT

Core Element #6-8: Incident Reporting & Investigation Procedures,
HIB Reporting

- * *HIBster* – implementation of software program, support



Submitting the School's Self-Assessment Data

- Upon BOE approval, the ratings for each school are formally submitted to the NJDOE.

- Formal submission includes:
 1. Dr. Glazer's certification of each school's electronically submitted ratings and
 2. the *Statement of Assurances* including the BOE approval date.



Public Reporting and Review of the Grades

- Grades received by a school and the district shall be posted on the homepage of the school's website and the district's website within 10 days of notification.
- Grades will be reviewed with the BOE at a public meeting.
