Concern #1: Communication

Suggestions:

- Provide FAQ or survival guide with information for both parents and students
- As we get closer to transition, a **staff liaison** can direct questions from parents to provide consistent messaging
- As we get closer, 5th and 6th grade students will visit JHWMS during school hours

Suggestions:

- **Graduation** The district would need to plan for and communicate for 4 single-session days for the 2025-2026 SY. Kindergarten graduation on Mon. June 15th, 5th grade graduation on Tues. June 16th, 6th grade graduation on Wed. June 17th, and the last day of school on Thurs. June 18th (everything backs up based on snow days)
- Patrol Posts positions will be offered to both 5th and 6th graders during 2025-2026 SY.

Suggestions that may vary by building:

- Yearbook create 5th grade yearbook and 6th grade yearbook
- Graduation Promotion Dance hold separate 5th and 6th grade committees and coordinate dates for dances
- Talent Show/Variety Show opening act assigned to 5th or 6th grade and closing act assigned to 5th or 6th grade
- Car Wash one fall car wash, one spring car wash allows both grades to host a car wash fundraiser
- Clap Out continue as normal, just extend the time to include both 5th and 6th graders


