SECRETARY'S REPORT:

"The advertisement for bids for the proposed addition to the Nutley High School appeared in the May 15, 1969 issue of The Nutley Sun. Bids will be accepted on Tuesday, June 17, 1969, . A contraction of the state of at 2:00 p.m. Lat. Mars publication a

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"Bids for brickfacing the Washington School were received, May 27, 1969, at 2:00 p.m. A resolution requesting your approval is before you this evening.

"Bids were also received yesterday for furnishing and/or installing and furnishing aluminum doors at the Washington School. Since only one bid was received, a resolution is being submitted requesting that the bid be rejected.

"As the Board approved, the \$1,655,000 approved by the voters last October 8, 1968 is being borrowed on a monthly basis from the First National State Bank at 4-1/4%. The first sum borrowed as of May 1, 1969 was in the amount of \$138,000. \$75,000 of this amount has been re-invested at 6.36%. The balance is being used to pay bills due on the project.
