The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Town of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 149 Chestnut Street, on Wednesday, April 29, 1970, at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Edward Lenihan, President, presiding.

MINUTES:

Copies of the Minutes of the Regular Meeting held on March 25, 1970, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mrs. Peddieson moved that the minutes of the Regular Meeting be accepted, seconded by Mrs. Popadick, and unanimously approved by the Board.

Copies of the Minutes of the Special Meeting held on April 8, 1970, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mrs. Peddieson moved that the minutes of the Special Meeting be accepted, seconded by Mrs. Jaworek, and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

1. A letter from John K. Pfeiffer, Vice President, Standard & Poor's Corporation:

"Pursuant to your request for a contract rating on the above issue, (\$1,615,000 New Jersey School District Bonds) we have reviewed the information presented to us and have assigned the rating of 'AA' High Grade to these bonds. If you have any questions relative to this rating we will be pleased to answer them."

2. A letter from Elmer J. Herrmann, Clerk, Essex County Board of Elections:

"The County Board of Elections respectfully requests the use of the following Public Schools for the Primary Election to be held on June 2, 1970 and the General Election, November 3rd, 1970 from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.:

"The district boards are requested to meet at the polling place three quarters of an hour before the polls open. It is, therefore, important that the school buildings be available at that time.

"While the polls are open to voters between the hours above stated, the district boards must remain until the statement of results are completed.

"The County Board would appreciate the assurance that there will be sufficient tables, chairs, light and heat when necessary. Will you kindly have your department in charge of this matter contact this office in reference to the particular location of the polling places in each school and the questions of equipment.

"We are taking several steps to enforce the law which the Board has adopted, that there will be no smoking in any of the Public Schools or polling places. All enforcement officers will be specifically instructed regarding this law.

3. A notice from Simeon F. Moss, Secretary, Associated Boards of Education with regards to the Annual Associated Boards Meeting to be held on Thursday, May 7, 1970, at the Holiday Inn, East Orange.

4. A letter to Mr. Edward J. Lenihan from Earl E. Mosier, Professor of Education, Montclair State College:

"Dr. Robert D. Fleischer served recently as guest lecturer to the graduate course, Introduction to Educational Administration. His lecture met with enthusiastic response. Students questioned him at length and reported later that Dr. Fleischer's presentation was among the most thought-provoking lectures this spring. The Nutley School System is indeed fortunate to attract and retain able leadership."

5. Copy of a letter sent from Eunice P. Drake, Town Clerk, Town of Nutley to Mrs. Carmine S. Ucci, Corresponding Secretary, Nutley Civic Celebrations, Inc.:

"Your letter of April 6, 1970, requesting that the Nutley Civic Celebrations, Inc. be granted permission to hold a display of fireworks at the Park Oval on Saturday, July 4th, 1970 (or, in the event of rain, on the following first clear night) was read at the meeting of the Board of Commissioners held April 21, 1970.

"At that time, a motion was adopted granting permission as requested, subject to the approval of the Board of Education and further, subject to compliance with all local ordinances and state laws concerning the detonation of fireworks, the filing of the proper Bond with the Town, and the filing of the Liability Insurance, in accordance with the limits recommended by the Town Insurance Committee, for the protection of the Town of Nutley, the Board of Education, and Nutley Civic Celebrations, Inc."

6. A letter from Carl L. Marburger, Commissioner of Education, Department of Education, State of New Jersey:

"Law Day, U. S. A. has been celebrated annually on the first day of May since its establishment by a joint resolution of the 87th Congress. Its purposes are to foster respect for law and understanding of its essential place in American life, to encourage citizen support of law observance and law enforcement, to advance equality and justice under the law and to point up the contrast between freedom under law in the United States and governmental tyranny elsewhere.

"Understanding of, and respect for, rights and responsibilities under the law are a part of the total educational process, and an essential ingredient of the curriculum. While I am strongly supportive of recent decisions of the courts which have given new dimensions to children's rights under the constitution, I am equally concerned that our schools shall actively participate in developing among pupils a clear understanding of the responsibilities which accompany those rights.

"I know that time is short - Law Day is Friday, but I urge you to conduct a program, if possible, or inject a message to the students in your daily routine which will emphasize the importance of law in our society."

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Zabriskie presented and read the following report:

"Work at the high school appears to be proceeding satisfactorily at the present time. Floors are being poured and the walls and brick work on the exterior are being run up past the first floor. It is my understanding that the concrete will be poured in the basement area in the new gymnasium this week. I have not had time to solicit bids for the equipment needed for the high school addition because we are presently taking bids for equipment for the 1970-1971 school year. Also, I want to be sure that some areas are completed in order to store furniture and equipment, consequently, we will hold off orders for furniture and equipment.

"The work at the Yantacaw School is proceeding and the areas should be completed within the next week or two. The aluminum windows should be delivered in approximately six weeks.

"There has been considerable window breakage during the week the schools were closed. This breakage was almost equally divided among the schools.

"The Margaret Avenue-DeMuro Park site is almost completed; however, here again we have encountered considerable problems with vandalism. The large rubber bags which are used in the jumping pits were cut so badly that it will be necessary to send them out to be repaired. The young people are using the banks for sliding purposes, and the adults living in the area are evidently practising for their spring golf games. It may be necessary for the Board of Education and the Town of Nutley to fence in the entire area. I dislike seeing this, however, the area must be protected. The fieldhouse itself requires some equipment such as desks for the coaches, lockers for coaches and students, rubbing tables, medical cabinets and probably a whirlpool bath and medical room. This equipment should be installed prior to our September 1st use of the building for football."

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Mr. Zabriskie presented the financial report as of March 31, 1970, showing total funds available of \$6,767,398.42, contractual orders to date of \$6,229,311.38, leaving a balance of funds available of \$538,087.04.

"The usual Arbor Day ceremonies will be held at the various schools on Friday, May 1. The junior Olympics program which has met with so much success for the past eight years will be repeated on Friday, May 15. Spring Garden school will be defending its 1969 'title'. The Nutley high school music and arts festival will be held on Friday, May 8.

"The regular 1970 summer school program will be from Monday, June 22 through Friday, July 31. Registration will be on June 19 and June 22. The Title I programs will be from Monday, June 29 through Friday, July 24.

"Heidelberg Eastern, Inc. has invited two of our staff members, Mr. Vito Ziccardi and Mr. Thomas Barone, to attend an Offset Pressmen's Training School in preparation for the new offset press ordered for the graphic arts department.

"The training course will be for four days, June 15 through June 18.

"The annual college visitations by the guidance department will take place the week of May 18. The following colleges will be visited: Edinboro State, Alliance, Allegheny, Westminster, Grove City, Slippery Rock State, Steubenville, West Liberty State, Bethany, Waynesburg, Frostburg State, St. Joseph's, Mt. St. Mary's, and York.

"We have received more than 500 applications for elementary teaching positions. At the present time, there are five vacancies. Despite this 'over-supply' of elementary teachers, there are still acute shortages in specialized areas such as home economics, industrial arts, mathematics, and science.

"Nutley will have a rubella immunization program on May 20-21. Dr. Farley and Dr. Piserchia will administer the vaccination program to children in the kindergarten through the fourth grade on those days. This program is under the auspices of the Nutley Department of Health."

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$ 625,000 TEMPORARY NOTES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWN OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY:

Mr. Ohlson presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mrs. Jaworek, and unanimously approved by the Board:

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWN OF NUTLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to Title 18A, Education, of the New Jersey Statutes, Temporary Notes of the school district in the principal amount of not exceeding \$625,000 are hereby authorized to be issued in anticipation of the issuance of the bonds of the school district authorized by virtue of a proposal adopted by said board of education on September 18, 1968, and approved by the favorable vote of a majority of the legal voters present and voting at a school district election held on October 8, 1968, and now remaining unissued.

Section 2. The following matters in connection with said Temporary Notes are hereby fixed and determined:

MATURITY: As may be determined by the Secretary, but not later than one year after the date of the first note issued hereunder.

INTEREST RATE: As may be determined by the Secretary but not exceeding six per centum (6%) per annum.

FORM: As determined by resolution adopted April 29, 1970.

Section 3. The Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to determine all matters in connection with said notes not determined by this or a subsequent resolution, and the Secretary's signature upon said notes shall be conclusive evidence that all such matters have been so determined in manner and effect consistent with the form and substance of such notes.

Section 4. The Secretary is hereby authorized to sell said notes from time to time at private sale in such amounts as the Secretary may determine at a price not less than the principal amount thereof, and the Custodian of School Moneys is hereby authorized to deliver said notes from time to time to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof and payment therefor.

Section 5. The full faith and credit of the school district are hereby pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said notes and said notes shall be general obligations of the school district payable as to principal and interest from ad valorem taxes which may be levied upon all the taxable property within the school district without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 6. The Secretary is hereby directed to report in writing to this board of education at the meeting thereof next succeeding the date when any sale of notes pursuant to this resolution is made, such report to include the amount, date, description and interest rate of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

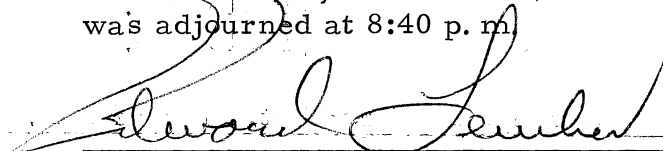

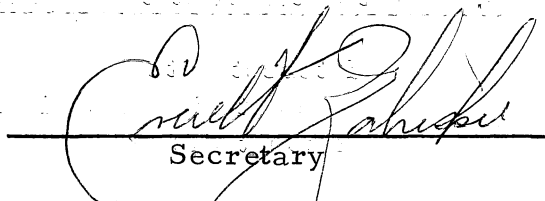

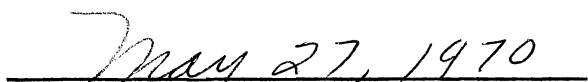
