"Regarding the non-renewal notice issued by the Globe Indemnity Company in connection with the above policy, this is to confirm our telephone conversation of May 19 that it does not fully disclose the understanding we have with the company.

"The understanding we have is that the Globe Indemnity Company is willing to renew the coverage as before, with the exception of Section I, where they have decided to retain 50% of the amount of insurance.

"As you know, we are arranging to secure the other 50% protection needed in Section I from another company, and at the present writing do not anticipate any difficulty in this instance.

"We hope to have the matter fully resolved very shortly, and will keep you posted when the results are known to us."

Mr. Zabriskie commented that he had received a telephone call from Mr. Myers and the remaining 50% of the fire insurance had been placed through Aetna Insurance Company.

# SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Zabriskie presented and read the following report:

"The work on the addition to the high school is progressing, however, renovation work in the guidance suite and the library areas will probably not be started until after the addition to the rear of the present building has been completed. The gymnasium area should be completed and ready for use by September 1st.

"It is necessary that Booth Drives and the area presently being used by our staff for parking be paved during the summer. We are faced with the problem of where to park cars belonging to twelve-month personnel as well as those belonging to the contractors. It will be necessary to pave Booth Drive first and sometime later the parking area.

"Work at the Yantacaw School is progressing very well, and the renovation work should be complete by the end of June.

"The maintenance crew is installing cork and blackboards at the Franklin School. We are attempting to complete as much work as possible prior to receipt of the new aluminum window replacements to be installed in the Yantacaw School and the gym area of the Franklin School. There will be approximately 300 windows installed during the summer.

"The Park Oval looks very well despite its heavy use. The groundsmen have been trimming and cutting grass at all of the schools.

"All orders for equipment requested for the 1970-1971 school year have been placed. The bids for fuel oil, milk, ice cream and bread and rolls are in resolution form for your approval this evening. This should complete all bidding required for material and equipment for the 1970-1971 school year."
