A Special Meeting of the Board of Education of the Town of Nutley, New Jersey, was called to order by the Secretary, temporary chairman, Mr. Zabriskie read the following:

> "Pursuant to Chapter 10, Section 18A:10-3, of the revised School Laws of 1968, the Board of Education of the Town of Nutley, Essex County, New Jersey, as constituted for the School Year 1972-1973, shall meet on Monday following the Annual School Election, for the purpose of organizing.

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Mrs. Popadick nominated Mrs. Jaworek for President, seconded by Mr. Clayton. Upon being put to a vote, Mrs. Jaworek was unanimously elected President of the Nutley Board of Education as constituted for the 1972-1973 School Year. Mr. Piro moved that the Secretary cast one vote for Mrs. Jaworek, seconded by Mr. Clayton, and approved. a the tax to a constant

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Mrs. Jaworek stated that before opening the floor for the nomination of a Vice-President she would like to thank the members of the Board for their confidence in electing her as their President and stated that she was flattered and most humble. She commented that she realized that this was a responsible position and that the position had been handled by a very capable person for eighteen years, and she expressed a deep debt of gratitude as did the community for the unstinting time and effort that Mr. Lenihan and Mrs. Peddieson had expended in behalf of the Board of Education. She also expressed the desire that the new Board would work well together to continue with the fine tradition as in the past.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education leases the Church Street School to the Nutley Historical Society for a period of twenty years commencing February 14, 1972, and · 39

# LEASE OF BOARD PROPERTY ON OVERLOOK TERRACE:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That they will not acquire any rights or claims in or to any of the lands of the Board of Education by reason of the extension of these fences.
