Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey May 23, 1973

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Town of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 149 Chestnut Street, on Wednesday, May 23, 1973, at 8:00 p.m., with Mrs. Thomas E. Jaworek, President, presiding.

#### FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Albert E. Cameron leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

## ROLL CALL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mr. John E. Clayton, Jr., Mr. Theodore J. Berger, Mr. Albert E. Cameron, Jr., Mr. Walter Lindstrom, Mr. James M. Piro, Mrs. Edward M. Popadick, Mr. Gerard T. Restaino and Mr. Frank V. Tangorra. Approximately 25 citizens present.

Mrs. Jaworek stated that in order to make it easier for her to communicate with the public at the meetings, she had changed the seating arrangements so that she would be able to face the public during the public meetings.

She further stated that in order to give the citizens an opportunity to make their views known to the Board, two items had been added to the agenda. The first would be "Hearing of Citizens", at which point of the agenda the Board would recognize citizens with reference to items on the agenda. The second item follows the resolutions, whereby citizens would be recognized in order that they could make comments with regard to items in general with respect to policies of the Board or other matters.

# MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on April 25, 1973, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Clayton moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mrs. Popadick, and unanimously approved by the Board.

## COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following communications:

A letter to the Members of the Nutley Board of Education from Joan Cantagallo:

"I was extremely pleased to read that the Board in this town will receive additional federal funds, allowing the Board to add three teachers to their staff, one being a teacher for the handicapped.

"I am a student at Newark State College, Union, majoring in Speech and Hard of Hearing, which has broadened my interest in the field of Special Education. Nutley has always done a fine job of working with disabled students; I saw a few attend Nutley High School as I did until 1971, when I graduated.

"With this addition of funds, there can be room for much more development which would really enhance the reputation the Nutley educational system now has. Please keep up the great work and interest. The exceptional child needs this care and attention much more than we do.

"A few months ago I attended a special class in Lincoln School under the direction of Mrs. Beaton. Everyone was very helpful and cooperative in letting me observe, which was impressive. The fact that this town cares much more than some other towns makes me proud to be a Nutley resident."

"We would like to thank you and the other members of the Board of Education for affording us the opportunity to visit Washington, D. C. It was a wonderful experience for us, and we felt very proud to perform in our nation's capitol with our teachers and friends.

"We hope we have fulfilled your trust in us."

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following report:

"As has been the case for the last few months, the major project of the maintenance crew has been the remodeling of the Special Education Center. Floors have been poured, and tiling is presently being installed in the five courts on the second floor, and as much of the work on the first floor as could be done without interrupting the use of the present facilities has been done. We expect to have a busy summer in this building.

"At the high school the significant work accomplished during the past month has been the installation of shelving in the drafting room, the repair of exterior doors, and the replacement of glass.

"Four more portable bookcase units have been fabricated and delivered to Washington School. One of the carpenters is presently working on special purpose cabinets for Yantacaw School.

"Material for several cabinets has been milled out and sent to the Special Education Center. The fact that the maintenance department did not assemble the cabinets was not to save them time, but was done primarily to afford the Special Education students the opportunity to assemble them and thereby acquire a degree of skill in a vocational experience. This has proved to be a profitable experience for them.

"In the grounds department the grounds crew has been doing a very creditable job under extreme adverse conditions. The extreme amount of rain has not only cut into their work days, but has created a grass cutting situation which requires much more time than was anticipated. School grounds and baseball fields are being maintained and upgraded.

"With the award of the contract for roofing of Yantacaw School, (the contractor having already been alerted) I anticipate actual work will begin tomorrow morning. Rigging material was brought to the job site and set up yesterday, but no work was accomplished today because of the rain.

# FINANCIAL REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented the financial report as of April 30, 1973, showing total funds available of \$6,793,214.10, contractual orders to date of \$6,429,459.44, leaving a balance of funds available of \$363,754.66.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Fleischer presented and read the following report:

"The annual music, industrial and fine arts program was held on Friday, May 11. The high school instrumental and choral groups presented a program to an appreciative and enthusiastic audience. In addition, exhibits of work done by students in the Industrial and Fine Arts Department were displayed in the gymnasium.

"There were two other programs recently held in our schools that are worthy of note. The elementary Reading Fair was held on May 16 and 17, 1973 at Radcliffe School and on May 15, 1973 the annual Fashion Show was held at the Franklin School. Staff members and students involved in making these programs possible are to be commended.

"We are also pleased to announce that Mario Ayala, a student in the Nutley High School, has won first place in the AAA National Traffic Safety Poster Contest. The reproduction of his poster will be circulated throughout the United States for the coming year's calendar posters.

"The annual patrol boys picnic will be held on Wednesday, June 6, 1973. This affair is jointly sponsored by the Elks Club, the police department and the school system. On Thursday, June 7, the Third Half Club's All Sports Dinner will be given.

"As of this date, 314 Nutley High School seniors have been accepted at higher education institutions. This represents 65 per cent of the class. The following information may be of interest.

# HEARING OF CITIZENS:

Mr. Thomas Hanlon, 550 Centre Street, commented that he was in agreement with Mr. Restaino's suggestion that appointments should come from within the school system. Several Board members commented that the Board had given considerable thought and consideration to the football coach appointment and that after much deliberation had made the decision which appeared in the resolution this evening.

Mr. Raymond Peccatiello, 136 Rutgers Place, questioned the resolution with regard to Summer Employment which stated at a rate of pay agreed upon by the Board of Education. Dr. Fleischer commented that the Board establishes rates of pay and salaries by resolution and then adopts salary guides, copies of which he would send to Mr. Peccatiello.

Mr. A. Budd, 31 Edgar Place, questioned how the appointments were made for junior aides and teacher aides. Dr. Fleischer stated that this is done through applications received at the central office, and then upon the recommendation of Mr. Fowler, Assistant Superintendent, appointments are then made. He further commented that the junior aides usually volunteer while they are attending high school and then continue on as paid teacher aides during their college years.

Mr. F. V. Hermo, 45 Chestnut Street, questioned that if a principal does not recommend tenure for a teacher, can the Board over-rule this decision? Dr. Fleischer stated that the Board of Education has the final authority on such a question.

It was also asked what time the teachers report for duty, to which Dr. Fleischer replied that they report at least ten minutes before the students arrive and they leave the building not less than fifteen minutes after the dismissal of the students.

Mrs. Jaworek introduced Mr. William H. Gilligan, Principal of Franklin School, Mrs. Margaret Murray and Mr. Vincent Pecoraro, Guidance Counselors. They briefly outlined the scope of the Junior High School Guidance Program, and then more fully discussed the orientation program for students from elementary schools to Franklin School and Franklin School to the Nutley High School.

Mr. Restaino read the following letter from Mrs. Marie Giorgio and Mrs. Joan Francis, Co-Chairwomen - Band Committee, The Music Boosters Association:

"Attached is a copy of the letter I received from Mr. Colin L. Kelly of the Marriott Hotel about the recent band trip to Washington D.C.
