Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey June 27, 1973

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Town of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 149 Chestnut Street, on Wednesday, June 27, 1973, at 8:00 p.m., with Mrs. Thomas E. Jaworek, President, presiding.

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. John E. Clayton, Jr. leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

ROLL CALL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mr. John E. Clayton, Jr., Mr. Theodore J. Berger, Mr. Albert E. Cameron, Jr., Mr. Walter Lindstrom, Mr. James M. Piro, Mrs. Edward M. Popadick, and Mr. Gerard T. Restaino. Absent and excused: Mr. Frank V. Tangorra. Approximately 15 citizens present.

MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on May 23, 1973, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Clayton moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mrs. Popadick, and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following communications:

1. A letter to Mr. Ramsland from Francis P. Berry:

"My wife, Anne, and I will always keep the memory of a pleasurable evening on the occasion of the dinner given by the Nutley Board of Education to honor the retirees of the school system. It was most pleasant to be with the board members, Dr. Fleischer and the invited guests.

"The engraved silver tray presented to Anne will continually be a visible reminder to her of the happy years teaching her fourth grade classes at Radcliffe School.

"Please convey to the board members the appreciation we feel for this particular evening. Also extend our wishes for a continuation of the outstanding record that the Nutley Board of Education has attained in their educational administration."

2. A letter to Mrs. Thomas Jaworek, President, from Mary Logan:

"My sincere thanks to you and all the members of the Board of Education for honoring me on the occasion of my retirement. The beautiful tray you presented to me will be a lasting remembrance of my teaching years in the Nutley School System.

"My very best wishes to all of you, and thank you again for an evening of happy memory."

3. <u>A letter to Mrs. Adele F. Jaworek, President, from Clyde Leib,</u> New Jersey School Boards Association:

"Dr. Mark Hurwitz, executive director, has asked me to acknowledge receipt of the Nutley Board of Education's resolution regarding the New Jersey State Interscholastic Association.

"As you know, the Delegate Assembly of NJSBA has referred the matter of the NJSIAA to committee, with the charge to report back recommendations to the delegates at the December meeting. I have been assigned responsibility for the staffing of this committee.

"I wish to point out that the responsibility of the committee is not to place the NJSIAA on trial or to judge that group's competency, but only to investigate the current method of due process in interscholastic athletics and to recommend, if found advisable, an improved method. Nevertheless, I wish to thank you for giving the association the benefit of your thinking and advice."

4. A letter to Mr. Ramsland from Carmen A. Orechio, Mayor, Town of Nutley:

"On behalf of the Senior Citizens in our Town I am interested in obtaining the 26 passenger Ford Bus that I understand you will be replacing.

"Would you kindly discuss with the members of the Board of Education at the meeting tomorrow night if they would consider selling the bus for \$1.00 for use of the Senior Citizens.

"The present bus we are using is about ready to retire and a replacement vehicle is needed at this time to carry out our present program."

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following report:

"Work has been continuing at the Special Education Center at Washington Avenue as it has since last fall. One or more of our maintenance men have been working there almost continually. During the past month the ceramic tile has been installed and the new fixtures set in the five courts on the second floor. Some rearrangements of the existing spaces have been scheduled for the summer months.

School, one for the music room and the other for a classroom. Roofs have been repaired at Washington, Franklin and Spring Garden schools. Bulletin boards have been installed at the Nutley High School and Franklin School and 500 feet of cork stripping has been installed in the corridors at Spring Garden. This latter for the display of the children's art work. Broken windows have been replaced in several of the schools. In preparing for the painting of Washington School this coming summer loose and missing ceiling tiles have been replaced in several of the rooms and other preparatory repairs have been made. Plumbing leaks have been repaired in a few places and stoppages have been cleared in several places in the system. A particularly annoying stoppage at Franklin School has finally been cleared.

"In addition to the above, which has been accomplished by the maintenance department, the re-roofing at Yantacaw School which was a contract job, has been going on during the past month between the rainy days. The main roof was finished last week and the contractors are now working on the lower roof areas.

"The stands at the Park Oval were erected for the high school and Franklin School graduation ceremonies and have since been removed in order to allow use of the field for American Legion baseball games during the summer. The addition of several college boys to our grounds crew for the summer months is giving much needed assistance to our men in taking care of the lawns and shrubbery which have been flourishing under the spring rains and our athletic fields which need continual attention.

"I would like to publicly recognize two of our head custodians who are retiring at this time. Mr. Roy Kierstead is retiring from Spring Garden School after $23\frac{1}{2}$ years of service. Mr. Frank Satzger is leaving Yantacaw School after devoting 18 years to service in Nutley. Both of these men have been loyal, dedicated, and competent employees of the Nutley School System, and their retirements will leave vacancies which will be very difficult to fill.

"For next year, there will be about 85 pupils enrolled in the Nutley Trainable Program. Forty-five will be at the Training Center and 40 will be at Lincoln School. The East Orange program was "phased out" and we are receiving 22 pupils from this program. We are rapidly becoming the center for trainable pupils as planned. We will probably have an eventual enrollment of about 150 pupils.

"The 1972-73 school year has been an eventful one and your Superintendent of Schools is appreciative of the support, encouragement and cooperation he has received from the Board of Education, the staff, the students, and the general public. "

Upon being put to a vote, motion was approved by a vote of 5 to 3 with Mr. Cameron, Mrs. Popadick and Mrs. Jaworek casting the dissenting votes.

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Mr. Restaino commented that he had received several phone calls with regard to how individual members of the Board of Education had voted on the head football coach position. He stated that he told them how he had voted but that they must contact individual members if they wished to know how they voted. He further stated that in caucus he had voted for another individual, who was an active coach in the school system, but since this person did not receive enough votes he had now changed his vote to Mr. Mario Cocchiola because he is a firm believer in promoting from within the school system and would support Mr. Cocchiola in his new position.

Mr. Cameron stated that he had always maintained that the citizens of Nutley had a right to know how members of the Board of Education voted on various issues. He commented that he did not vote for Mr. Cocchiola in private but did vote for another candidate from within the system. Unfortunately, the only way he was able to express his vote was by voting against Mr. Cocchiola in public. Mr. Cocchiola brings excellent qualifications to this position and he deserves and would receive Mr. Cameron's full support, and he would also receive the support of the entire Board, the administration, the teaching staff, the football players, and the citizens of Nutley. Mr. Cameron then moved that the vote for Mr. Cocchiola be made unanimous. The motion died for lack of a second.

Mrs. Popadick stated that she did not vote for Mr. Cocchiola but had voted for another candidate according to the dictates of her conscience but that Mr. Cocchiola would receive her full support.

Mr. Piro stated that much has been said, and he wanted to say that it is very unfortunate that the Board could not present a united front on the appointment of the head football coach, especially since the school, the community, and the Board of Education had been in a state of controversy for a long time on this particular issue. This Board has always

tried to present a united front on personnel appointments regardless of the divergence of opinion in caucus. The policy has been to give the new appointee a vote of confidence and to minimize the creation of controversy and criticism in the school and the community. Unfortunately, the policy was not adhered to on this particular issue.

Mrs. Jaworek commented that the Board did not have such a policy as Mr. Piro stated. She further commented that she had not voted for Mr. Cocchiola because she was a firm believer in the democratic process.
