Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey

February 18, 1974

ROLL CALL:

The meeting was called to order at 8:20 p.m. by the Secretary, Temporary Chairman. Mr. Ramsland called the roll. Members present at roll call were: Mrs. Thomas E. Jaworek, Mr. John E. Clayton, Jr., Mr. Theodore J. Berger, Mr. Albert E. Cameron, Mr. Walter Lindstrom, Mr. James M. Piro, Mrs. Edward M. Popadick, Mr. Gerard T. Restaino and Mr. Frank V. Tangorra. Approximately 20 citizens.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF PURPOSE OF MEETING:

Mr. Ramsland, temporary chairman, read the following:

"Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:10-3, the organization meeting of the new Board of Education of the Town of Nutley will be held on Monday evening, February 18, 1974, at 8:00 p.m. in the Board Room, Administration Building, 149 Chestnut Street, Nutley.

"The purpose of this meeting is to organize the new Board of Education and to transact such other business as may come before the Board."

ADMINISTRATION OF OATH TO NEW BOARD MEMBERS:

Mr. Ramsland administered the Oath of Office to Mrs. Edward M. Popadick, Mr. Walter S. Lindstrom and Mr. Frank V. Tangorra.

ELECTION OF PRESIDENT:

Mr. Ramsland assumed the chair and announced that the first item of business on the agenda will be the election of officers for the coming year. Nominations are open for the office of President.

Mrs. Edward M. Popadick nominated Mrs. Adele Jaworek for President, Mr. Tangorra seconded the nomination. Mrs. Jaworek thanked Mrs. Popadick and Mr. Tangorra for the nomination and commented that she appreciated the confidence shown by the nomination and second but that she must respectfully decline. She further commented that when she was elected two years ago and then re-elected she decided then that she did not want to start another precedent of long tenure because she felt a long tenure was not healthy for the school system and the transition was too great. She added that she hoped future Board members would follow her example and not hold the presidency for many years as in the past.

She also commented that she had also given really too much of herself and her family had certainly suffered because of this. She ended by commenting that it had not been an easy two years, therefore, she must decline the nomination but that she would continue to do her best as a continuing member of the Board of Education.

Mr. Lindstrom nominated John Clayton, seconded by Mr. Piro, for president. Mrs. Popadick nominated Frank Tangorra, seconded by Mr. Gerard Restaino.

Since there were no other nominations, Mr. Ramsland declared the nominations closed. He then indicated that the voting would be by a show of hands and asked if there was any objection to this procedure. There was none.

Mr. Ramsland asked for nominations for the position of vicepresident. Mr. Berger nominated Mr. Lindstrom, seconded by Mr. Piro. Mrs. Popadick nominated Mr. Tangorra, seconded by Mr. Restaino. Etling, both residents of Forest Avenue, to continue to extend their fences to connect with the Board's fence on the easterly side of the Spring Garden School property with the understanding that they will cause the fences to be removed on a 30 days' written notice from the Board, and
