Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey October 24, 1977

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Town of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 149 Chestnut Street, on Monday, October 24, 1977, at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Gerard T. Restaino, Temporary Chairman, presiding.

#### FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mrs. Imhoff leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

## ANNOUNCEMENT OF ADEQUATE NOTICE:

Mr. Restaino read the following notice:

#### ROLL CALL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mrs. Roy Imhoff, Mr. Carl Perez, Mrs. Bernard Rabinowitz, Mr. Robert Rusignuolo, Mr. Frank V. Tangorra, Mrs. John Wightman, and Mr. Louis F. Williams. Absent and excused: Mr. Walter Lindstrom. Approximately 68 citizens were present.

#### MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on September 26, 1977, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Perez moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Rusignuolo, and unanimously approved by the Board.

### COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Restaino presented the following communications:

## 1. A letter to Mr. Lindstrom from Joan Rubino:

"All over America angry parents are crying out against poor teachers. Unfortunately, many fine educators pass virtually unnoticed by parents and administrators alike. I am writing to you regarding Mrs. Elizabeth Chapin, a second grade teacher at Spring Garden School, because I think her outstanding performance deserves recognition.

"No matter what school my son attends it is unlikely that he is ever going to come in contact with a more interested, dedicated or conscientious person than Mrs. Chapin. She is the type of teacher every mother 'dreams' her child is going to have each year, and considers herself lucky when her child encounters one such person during the course of many years.

"Mrs. Chapin should be commended for the high standards she has set for herself and her students, for her conduct exemplifies the American ideal of a fine public educator."

# SECRETARY'S REPORT:

In the absence of Mr. Ramsland, Mrs. Darrow, Recording Secretary, presented and read the following report:

"The New Jersey School Boards Association's SCHOOL BOARD NOTES reports that 'In an issue of the NATION'S SCHOOL REPORT, Professor E. E. Loveless of the University of Nevada in Reno, pointed out that the amount of money spent in repairing vandalism in the schools each year, \$600 million, equals the amount spent on textbooks." I wondered how Nutley compared with the national problem.

"For the three year period ending last June, we spent \$149,344 for text-books, which is an average annual expenditure of \$49,781. For the same three year period, we spent \$38,404 for glass replacement and other repairs necessitated by vandalism, for an average annual expenditure of \$12,801. This is 25.7% of the amount spent for textbooks. I am not drawing the conclusion that vandalism is cheap in Nutley -- I'm only pointing out that our neighbors are spending far more than we are.

"A group of interested parents and teachers at Yantacaw School are planning to plant a tree and place a plaque at the school in memory of Steve Hornyak. The dedication will take place sometime in November.

"The Nutley Chamber of Commerce has again requested permission to use the Park Oval as a landing pad to bring Santa to Nutley on the day after Thanksgiving. Since Dancer, his lead reindeer, is somewhat under the weather, he will be coming in by helicopter.

"Twenty-one broken windows were replaced during the past month. Also completed by our maintenance staff were 17 different items of carpenter or roofing repairs, and 19 different items of plumbing repairs. We were short two men all month due to injuries, one of them having been out for 13 of the last 16 months.

"Fire drills were held at the various schools during the months of September and October.

"Mr. Max Kletter, Mathematics Department head, has been conducting in-service mathematics workshops for all of Nutley's elementary teachers. Effective today, all of our teachers will have had some exposure to Nutley's new mathematics course of study.

"Halloween will be celebrated in the elementary schools on Monday, October 31st. The morning dismissal will be at the regularly scheduled time. The lunch hour will be extended until 2:00 p.m., and the afternoon dismissal will be at 3:20 p.m.

"Mr. Louis Zwirek, principal of Nutley High School, has announced that he and his staff are planning for an Open House on the evening of October 26th. All of our other schools have held their first P. T. A. meetings for this school year. Each principal has informed me that the parent population has displayed an extreme interest in Nutley's educational program.

"Dr. Edward Fry and Mrs. Lucy Gillies will be with us this evening at approximately 8:30 to 9:00 p.m. for the purpose of reviewing Dr. Fry's evaluation report on Nutley's reading program. Mrs. Gillies will be happy to respond to questions concerning Nutley's total reading program."

Mr. Fowler then read the following letter:

"It is with mixed emotions that I submit my letter of resignation, effective July 31, 1978.

"This community has been unusually good to me. As a teacher, I had the opportunity to work with our most precious treasure, children. As Director of the Nutley Adult School, I learned the true meaning of cooperation. As Director of Special Services, I learned what it is like to work with those less fortunate, the handicapped. As Assistant Superintendent, I learned that teachers and administrators are the single most important ingredient in the education of children. As Superintendent, I have learned that the members of Nutley's Board of Education bring to their position a strong commitment to quality education for the children of the community.

"I would especially like to thank this Board of Education for the trust they have placed in me while delegating the authority that the office of the superintendency demands."

Mr. Tangorra made several comments with regard to the announcement of Mr. Fowler's resignation.
