Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey

March 26, 1979

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Town of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 149 Chestnut Street, on Monday, March 26, 1979, at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Louis F. Williams, President, presiding.

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Lindstrom leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF ADEQUATE NOTICE:

Mr. Williams read the following notice:

ROLL CALL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mrs. Roy Imhoff, Mr. Walter S. Lindstrom, Mr. Carl Perez, Mrs. Bernard Rabinowitz, Mr. Gerard T. Restaino, Mr. Frank V. Tangorra, and Mrs. John Wightman. Absent and excused: Mr. Robert Rusignuolo. Three citizens were present.

MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on March 6, 1979, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Lindstrom moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mrs. Wightman, and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

1.

A letter from Roger D. Chesley, Member, Millburn Board of Education, enclosing a draft resolution which is a reply to a questionnaire distributed by the Nutley Board of Education at their meeting with regard to the Essex Educational Services Commission (resolution follows):

"WHEREAS an education services commission has been established for Essex County and this district is eligible to become a member of the commission and participate in the services it will offer; and

"WHEREAS this Board is concerned that the preliminary planning for the commission has not sufficiently taken into account the interests and concerns of the boards of education of the districts that may become members; and

"WHEREAS this Board desires to express its basic policy with respect to the initial scope of the activities of the commission should it decide to become a member; and

"WHEREAS it would be beneficial to this Board in making its membership decisions to ascertain the view of other Essex County boards of education as to their basic policy with respect to the commission.

"RESOLVED, that it is the basic policy of this Board of Education that the Essex County Educational Services Commission should

- (A) Limit the services it will initially offer to
- A special education program that will coordinate the existing cooperative arrangements among member districts in a manner that will permit the home district of the students involved the maximum flexibility in the placement of the students with an emphasis on provision of appropriate programs in or as near to the home district as is economically feasible;
- (ii) A direct services program similar in scope to that currently undertaken by the direct services cooperative; and
- (iii) A computer services program that will maximize the use on a cooperative basis of computer facilities and services presently available to member districts.
- (B) Not attempt to offer additional services until there has been sufficient experience with the initial service programs to permit member districts to evaluate the effectiveness of such service programs and no new service program should be offered unless the program has been carefully planned and there is reasonable assurance that the proposed program will

offer substantially improved services or the same quality of services with substantially more efficiency than the methods of providing such services then being used by member districts.

- (C) (i) Limit its administrative organization and expenses to a level consistent with that necessary to efficiently provide the support for the service programs being offered;
- (ii) Utilize to the maximum extent feasible the facilities and administrative personnel of member districts on a contract basis where separate commission facilities and personnel cannot be economically justified; and
- (iii) Rely to the maximum extent possible on the administrative and professional personnel of member districts on a voluntary or cooperative basis in the research, planning and evaluation of service projects, and it shall be the policy of this Board to cooperate in making its facilities and personnel available to the Commission for these purposes; and further

"RESOLVED, that since this statement of basic policy may be useful to boards of education in other Essex County districts in determining whether to become members of the commission and statements of basic policy adopted by such boards of education may be of assistance to this Board in making its membership decision, the Secretary of the Board is directed to send a copy of these resolutions to the board of education of each Essex County district and request such boards of education to send to this Board a copy of any resolution or other policy statement it may have adopted with respect to the commission."

2. A letter from the Audubon Board of Education with regard to revenues from casino gambling and a copy of a press release on the subject. Also enclosed was the following resolution:

"WHEREAS, the revenue from casino gambling is far in excess of anticipated funds, and

"WHEREAS, the senior citizens of the state have incurred an everincreasing share of school costs, therefore,

"BE IT RESOLVED that the New Jersey School Boards Association petition the Legislature to develop a program whereby these funds are pro-rated equitably among municipalities to reduce the everincreasing share of school tax paid by senior citizens."

3. <u>A letter from Charles Weisel</u>:

"On behalf of her family, I want to thank you and the Nutley Board of Education for the sympathy extended and for the recognition tendered in the resolution passed on January 22, 1979.

"Her family knew Blanche Weisel as a loving, warm and considerate person. We were aware of her many interests and her various experiences. But none of us were aware of the depth of her involvement in the activities of the Nutley community or her continuing interest in former students ... at least to the extent that became apparent as we went through her papers and memorabilia.

"As a former student of hers who was her postman volunteered to me shortly after her death: 'She was a wonderful teacher. They don't come that way anymore.'

"Again thank you for remembering Blanche with the resolution. We also appreciated your letter of sympathy."

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

"Letters have been sent to all residents of Ward 2 District 2 informing them that their polling place for school elections is changed from Spring Garden to Radcliffe School.

"Budget brochures are at the Post Office and are scheduled for delivery to every town resident on Wednesday of this week.

"The leadership role which the Nutley Board of Education assumed in opposing the takeover of Direct Services under Chapter 192 & 193 by the new Essex County Educational Services Commission has paid off. The EIC/Northeast will continue to provide these services to Nutley's non-public school children next year. I am sure that our Board's forthright and unequivocal position has encouraged other Essex County Boards to stand with us in our resolve to find an acceptable alternative to the Commission.

WHEREAS, even though Dr. Brown won recognition and success in his chosen field, it was as a man and friend that he was held in the highest esteem by all who touched his life,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education of the Town of Nutley expresses its feeling of great loss and extends to his family its warmest sympathy, and
