September 22, 1980

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Town of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 149 Chestnut Street, on Monday, September 22, 1980, at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Louis F. Williams, President, presiding.

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Eisenfelder leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

ROLL CALL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mr. Douglas Eisenfelder, Mrs. Jacqueline Imhoff, Mr. James Murray, Mr. Carl Perez, Mrs. Ann Rabinowitz, Mr. Gerard T. Restaino, and Mrs. Marilyn Wightman. Absent and excused: Mr. Frank V. Tangorra. Ten citizens were present.

MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on August 25, 1980, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Perez moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Murray, and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following communications:

1. A notice from the Essex County Educational Services Commission with regard to a meeting to be held on October 1, 1980.
2. A copy of a letter to Mayor Orechio from Mrs. JoAnn A. Carney, Librarian of Nutley High School:

"As a Nutley resident of ten years with more than an average interest in the Nutley Public Library, I am concerned about the recent disaster there and would like to submit the following suggestion.

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" 'Patching up' the existing building which the Library has outgrown in terms of collection size and services would be a waste of money. The services which are offered to citizens and, in particular, students were cramped before the ceiling collapsed.

"A new building which would expand and combine the services of the Nutley Public Library and the Nutley High School Library would be highly desirable. This facility could be located on the portion of the land between New and William Streets where a mall type parking lot is already under consideration. This arrangement and location would accomplish the following.

1. Provide a better 'buffer zone' between the High School and the Senior Citizen housing building.
2. Give the Public Library more space for books, patron seating and expanded services.
3. Relieve the Public Library staff of the high school student service work-load and allow them to concentrate on the rest of the population.
4. Provide the High School Library with a better location for servicing students than it occupies at present.

"The advantages and disadvantages of combining these libraries, which have functioned cooperatively as neighbors for so many years, are a topic for lengthy investigation and discussion. This should certainly involve school and library administrators. Mr. Bernaudo and I have discussed it informally from the 'pie in the sky' point of view.

"Funding could be jointly shared by the Town and the Board of Education, as De Muro Park is funded. The New Jersey State Library, Bureau of Library Development also administers funds for building construction. The Governor's Conference on Libraries stressed greater cooperation between school and public libraries in the State Library Network. Funds may be available for a project such as the one outlined briefly here. In your capacity as Senator for the district you may be aware of other possibilities.

"As Mayor, State Senator, and Nutley resident you can evaluate this suggestion with unique insights into the Town, its citizens, and services. Please give it your best shot."

3. A letter from the 1979-1980 Nutley High School Rifle Team:

"I realize this note is late for which I must extend my apologies.

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"The members of the 1979-80 Nutley High School Rifle Team would like me to extend to you a 'thank you' for the wonderful gifts you presented them last spring. The jackets are really very handsome and useful. They will truly be a treasured memento to remind them of their State Championship season.

"It isn't often in this day and age that people take the time to say 'well done'. Rifle is a sport that receives limited publicity. The members of the team really appreciate what you did for them and were glad that they could do something to make the Town of Nutley and the Nutley Board of Education proud of."

4. A letter from Pat D'Antuono and David Levine, Retail Co-Chairmen, Nutley Chamber of Commerce:

"The Retail Division of the Nutley Chamber of Commerce is planning to repeat our Christmas program of last year with town-wide participation of Nutley merchants and businessmen. We hope to have Santa arrive in town via helicopter and wish to ask your permission to have this helicopter set down in the Nutley Park Oval.

"The preferred time for this event would be Friday, November 28th, at 2:00 p.m. In case of inclement weather the date would be set for Saturday, November 29th at 2:00 p.m. If this is impossible we would appreciate your advice as to a suitable time.

"We thank you for your consideration and would appreciate a reply at your earliest convenience in order to make the necessary arrangements and secure town clearance."

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following report:

"Now that the 1980-81 school year has started, it is time to begin preparing the 1981-82 budget. I have enclosed with your agenda material a proposed timetable for each phase of budget preparation.

"The changeover to the new electrical panel at Franklin School is scheduled for Thursday and Friday, November 13 and 14, the days of the NJEA Convention, when school will be closed.

"The high school ceiling replacement program is complete. The electrician is finishing up some extra work in connection with emergency lighting, which was not a part of the contract, but was advisable to do while he was rewiring for the new lights.
