The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, March 14, 1983, at 8:30 p.m., with Mrs. Ann Rabinowitz, President, presiding.

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Perez leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following report:

"In my March report last year, I included a tabulation of votes in the last ten school elections. It showed quite clearly that in the years when there were no serious challengers for Board seats, the budget vote was very light. Conversely, when 4th and

5th place candidates came close to #3, the budget vote was close to double. This same chart, with 1972 deleted and 1982 added, is presented below for whatever statistical analysis you care to engage in.

"The boat dock situation continues to be very frustrating. The date set by the Army Corps of Engineers for receipt of any objections has passed, but now they are saying that they have fifteen days to issue the permit. When we try to impress upon them the fact that we need the facility now, not after the crew season is over, they are very sympathetic and say they will try to expedite matters, but it doesn't happen. The engineer, who has had many years of experience in dealing with river and coastal applications, says he has never seen anything like the red tape and delays of this application.

"Our buses and vans have been vandalized twice in the past week. Over the weekend, a number of aeriols, windshield wipers, and mirrors were broken off. Then on Monday night, 22 tires were slashed. It was little consolation to hear that vehicles in other parts of town were also similarly vandalized.

"I would like to specifically commend the custodians, the grounds crew and 'Mr. Gino' for the clean-up of the snow from the 'Blizzard of '83.' To a man, they worked with a dedication that made me proud. While these men are admittedly not teachers, they are part of the team. Their job was to make it possible for the teachers and students to come in on Monday, and they did their job well.

"In the maintenance department, 12 lights of glass were replaced this past month. Sixteen items of carpentry and general repairs were made, as were 19 plumbing and heating repairs or replacements.

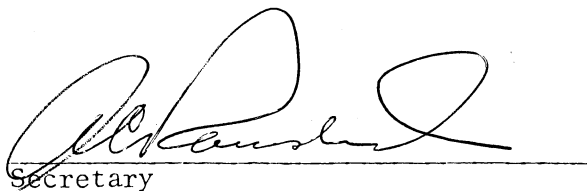
