The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, March 21, 1983, at 8:50 p.m., with Mrs. Ann Rabinowitz, President, presiding.

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Williams leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Dr. Anthony N. Baratta, Mr. Douglas Eisenfelder, Mrs. Jacqueline Imhoff, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., Mr. Joseph Malanga, Mr. Carl Perez, Mr. Frank V. Tangorra, and Mr. Louis F. Williams. Eight citizens were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

WHEREAS, the summer session operated by the Nutley Board of Education meets the requirements for State approval,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Superintendent of Schools make application to the County Superintendent of Schools with a request for approval from the State Department of Education.

KINDERGARTEN APPROVAL:

Mrs. Imhoff presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Malanga, and unanimously approved by the Board:

WHEREAS, the State Department of Education requires a separate approval for State aid for kindergartens, and

WHEREAS, the kindergartens operated by the Nutley Board of Education meet the requirements for State kindergarten approval,

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BE IT RESOLVED, That the kindergarten report for 1982/ 1983 be presented to the County Superintendent of Schools with a request for approval from the State Department of Education.

529 WASHINGTON AVENUE PROPERTY:

Mr. Williams presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mrs. Imhoff, and unanimously approved by the Board:

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, at its meeting of November 22, 1982, adopted a resolution authorizing the President and Secretary to execute a contract of sale for the property at 529 Washington Avenue, Nutley, New Jersey with Paul Martino, and

WHEREAS, the said Paul Martino is in partnership with Anthony Baldino in the purchase of this property,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That Anthony Baldino's name be added to that of Paul Martino on the documents transferring ownership of the property at 529 Washington Avenue.

149 CHESTNUT STREET PROPERTY:

Mr. Williams presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Kucinski. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley has moved its administrative offices to 375 Bloomfield Avenue, occupying building space jointly with Radcliffe Elementary School, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it has no further need for the premises at 149 Chestnut Street, Nutley, New Jersey which formerly served as its administrative offices, and

WHEREAS, the Township of Nutley has determined that it does have need of additional space for its municipal operations,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley authorizes its President and Secretary to convey by deed to the Township of Nutley, for the sum of one dollar (\$1.00), the premises known as Lots 46, 47, and 48, Block 185 on the Assessment maps of the Township of Nutley, being commonly known as 149 Chestnut Street, Nutley, New Jersey.

CHANGE OF MEETING DATE - Organization Meeting:

Mr. Williams presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Malanga. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the Board of Education at its meeting of March 14, 1983 passed a resolution changing the date of the Organization Meeting from April 11 to April 18, 1983, and

WHEREAS, the April 18 date occurs during the spring recess,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the date of April 18 be changed to April 15, 1983.

WITHHOLDING OF INCREMENT:



Mr. Williams presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Kucinski. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Schools has recommended the withholding of sincrement for the 1983-1984 school year, and

WHEREAS, the Nutley Board of Education is of the opinion that there exists good cause for withholding employment and adjustment increments for the 1983-1984 school year,

BE IT RESOLVED, That shall be withheld for the 1983-1984 school year,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Superintendent of Schools is hereby authorized to provide with written notice of the Board's decision within ten days of the date of the resolution.

OLD BUSINESS:

Dr. Fadule read a thank you letter from Mrs. Alice Lester, Volunteer Chairman, Nutley Chapter of the American Red Cross, for the holding of a blood bank at Nutley High School.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Malanga stated that he would distribute to the Board copies of newsletters of the Livingston and Bloomfield Boards of Education. These newsletters are distributed to the students to take home to their parents and to the staff to keep people abreast of what is going on in these school districts. Mr. Malanga suggested that the Board think of doing something similar in Nutley.

Mr. Tangorra expressed his displeasure with regard to an article in the Star Ledger whereby the Department of Education withdrew New Jersey school districts from participation in the National Secondary Recognition Program. Mrs. Rabinowitz commented that at least the richness of the program at Franklin School had been recognized.

Mr. Tangorra commented that the bill had been passed by the legislature allowing boards of education to form self-insurance pools.

Mr. Perez stated that he would like to have an evaluation of the music department and how Mr. Kohere has been handling things, to which Dr. Fadule replied.

Mr. Malanga stated that many parents in the Radcliffe School district are unhappy that their children do not have any place to play basketball and asked Mr. Ramsland to check into the feasibility of putting a blacktopped area on the upper playground at Radcliffe School.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Board, on motion made by Mr. Tangorra, seconded by Mrs. Imhoff, the meeting was adjourned at 9:10 p.m.
