Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey January 23, 1984

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, January 23, 1984, at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Gerard T. Restaino, President, presiding.

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Hermo leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Dr. Anthony N. Baratta, Mr. Frank V. Hermo, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., Mr. Joseph Malanga, Mr. Carl Perez, and Mr. Robert Rusignuolo. Absent and excused: Mrs. Ann Rabinowitz and Mr. Louis F. Williams. Six citizens were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on December 19, 1983, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Perez moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Malanga and unanimously approved by the Board.

Copies of the minutes of the Special Meeting held on January 9, 1984, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Perez moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Malanga and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following communications:

1. A letter from the Yantacaw Student Council:

"In order to afford us the opportunity to personally thank you for helping to save our school as a result of its fire, you are cordially invited to attend Yantacaw's Appreciation Tea on Thursday, January 26, 1984. Presentations will be made and refreshments will be served in our school's auditorium from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m. We look forward to seeing you."

2. A letter from Mr. John K. Tiene and Mr. Joseph Carrino, Co-Chairmen, Nutley Jaycees:

"The Nutley Jaycees take pleasure in sending you, as a leading member of our community, a nomination form for our annual Distinguished Service Awards. We hope you will be able to submit one or more nominations, either from your organization or otherwise.

"The Nutley Jaycees Thirteenth Distinguished Service Awards Dinner will be held on Thursday, March 29, 1984 at the Friar Tuck Inn. On that evening five individuals who live or work in Nutley will be honored. Four for their contributions to the fields of Business, Education, Civic Affairs and Public Health & Safety. The fifth as outstanding Young Man or Woman.

"On behalf of the Nutley Jaycees, we thank you for your anticipated participation and wish your organization continued success in its endeavors."

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following report:

"The cafeteria report for December shows an overall increase in Type A lunches served over the same period a year ago for the fourth consecutive month, and has shown such an increase for six of the last seven months.

"The turnaround occurred last April and continued thru May. While June saw a regression from 11,463 to 10,745, a closer look reveals that June of 1982 had 19 school days, for a daily participation of 603.3, while June 1983 had only 17 school days, for a daily participation rate of 632.1. When the drop in enrollment is factored in, the increases look even better. For the four months of this school year, September thru December, the enrollment decline was 4.3% from the previous year, while Type A lunch participation increased 10.0%.

"The pattern at the high school is the same as the overall pattern, six of the last seven months. At Franklin, the increase is evident every month for a full year. I would like to take this opportunity to commend Miss Makurat and her staff for this turnaround, and Dr. Votto and Mr. Primamore for their valuable assistance in effecting these results.

"In the aftermath of the fire at Yantacaw School, well-deserved plaudits have been heaped upon the firemen, the custodians, Mr. Walker

and his staff, and the parents of Yantacaw School. All of these were well-deserved. I would like to take this opportunity to recognize another group of people without whose 100% cooperation the reopening would not have been possible.

"We often malign contractors as a rather independent lot, the coordinating of whose work is often quite frustrating. However, the following contractors cooperated to the fullest in getting Yantacaw School habitable during what would otherwise have been a holiday season for them:

"The only contractor who did not show up during that week was New Jersey Bell Telephone Company. Quite possibly they were having some problems of their own.

"In the maintenance department, glass replacement during the past month (exclusive of that caused by the fire at Yantacaw) was five. Twenty three items of carpentry and general repairs were made, and 13 items of plumbing and heating.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented the financial report as of December 31, 1983, showing total funds available of \$15,885,156.98, contractual orders to date of \$13,881,347.22, leaving a balance of funds available of \$2,003,809.76.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Fadule presented and read the following report:

'The staff and students of Yantacaw School have adapted quite well to their difficult situation.

"The implementation of our priorities is progressing quite well and reports to the Board are forthcoming over the next several months.
