Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, April 16, 1984, at 8:15 p.m., with Mr. Gerard T. Restaino, President, presiding.

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mrs. Scheckel leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Dr. Anthony N. Baratta, Mr. Sam Battaglia, Mr. Frank V. Hermo, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., Mr. Joseph Malanga, Mr. Charles J. Piro, Mr. Robert J. Rusignuolo, and Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel. Twelve citizens were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Organization Meeting held on April 9, 1984, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Kucinski moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Rusignuolo and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following communication:

1. A letter from James F. Mosior, Just Pets:

"We at Just Pets have done many class lectures and class trips dealing with pets and pet care. These programs are free, very educational, and have received very favorable responses. We would like to offer these programs to all the children in the Nutley school system. Please forward this information to any person who might make use of these programs."

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following report:

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"Hello and Goodbye - First the goodbyes. It is indeed a sobering thought to see one-third of the Board leave. Ann, Lou and Carl came to the Board together and for these past nine years have given generously of their time and talents in their quest to move the Nutley School System ever higher toward their goal of excellence. Though not always seeing eye-to-eye on procedure, they nevertheless played as team members and together they left their indelible marks on the school system from which our children are now reaping rich benefits. I extend my personal thanks to all three for their friendship, understanding, trust, and professional demeanor at all times, and wish them well in what I am sure will be a bright future for each of them.

"My congratulations to the three new Board members and to Bob Rusignuolo who was reelected. Bob, as well as Mrs. Scheckel, Mr. Battaglia, and Mr. Piro convinced the electorate that they are sincerely interested in continuing improvement in Nutley's schools, and I bid them a hearty welcome to the Board team.

"While we're on personalities, I would like to publicly express my deep gratitude to the fine citizens of Nutley who again this year gave their time to work at the polls conducting the election. This is one job we cannot do ourselves, we must turn to those of you who recognize the value of the right to vote. Many thanks -- and we'll be in touch with you again next year.
