Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey December 17, 1984

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, December 17, 1984, at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Gerard T. Restaino, President, presiding.

## FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Battaglia leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

# CALL OF ROLL:

# APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

## SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following report:

"More time has been devoted to budget preparation during the past month than to any other single project. It is scheduled for adoption at a Special Meeting to be held on January 7, 1985, at 8:00 p.m.

"In October, my estimate of the budget 'cap' for 85-86 was 7.0409%. It has now been confirmed to us to be 7.0299%. As the budget shapes up now, however, we should come in well below that cap.

"As for State Aid, the figures submitted to us at this point reflect 'full funding,' and this is about as likely to happen as a balanced Federal budget for next year.

"In the maintenance area, 8 windows were replaced last month. Thirty-three items of carpentry and general maintenance were completed, and 14 plumbing and heating repairs were made.

Mrs. Scheckel added that Nutley had received a compliment from Toby Simon of the New Jersey School Boards Association. The presentation of the Nutley administrators at the convention in October was very well received, and the New Jersey School Boards Association feels that Nutley is one of the outstanding school districts in the state.

Dr. Fadule explained that Miss Rose DiGeronimo, Mr. Anthony Stivala and Miss Helen Poole had made a presentation at the convention regarding the setting and raising of standards in the essential skills, and the development of the Nutley Achievement Tests. The presentation was very heavily attended.
