The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, March 11, 1985, at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Gerard T. Restaino, President, presiding.

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Battaglia leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Dr. Anthony N. Baratta, Mr. Sam Battaglia, Mr. Frank V. Hermo, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., Mr. Joseph Malanga, Mr. Charles J. Piro, and Mrs. Rosalie Scheckel. Absent: Mr. Robert Rusignuolo. Two citizens were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on February 25, 1985, at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mrs. Scheckel moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Kucinski, and unanimously approved by the Board.

HEARING OF CITIZENS:

Mrs. Joseph Shuster, 462 Chestnut Street, raised a question with regard to the repair work on the clock on the outside of the Franklin School, to which Mr. Ramsland replied.

TEACHING SUPPLY BID:

Mr. Battaglia presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Kucinski. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

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BE IT RESOLVED, That the Secretary-Business Administrator be authorized to purchase teaching supplies for the 1985/1986 school year under State Contract from J. L. Hammett Company, Union, New Jersey, in the amount of \$77,013.50, pursuant to the provisions of NJSA 18A:18A-10.

ADVERTISED NOTICE OF BUDGET HEARING:

Mr. Ramsland read the following legal notice, which appeared in the February 21, 1985 issue of THE NUTLEY SUN:

"The Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey will hold a Public Hearing on the tentative budget for the school year 1985/1986 at an open meeting in the Board of Education Meeting Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, Monday, March 11th, 1985, at 8:00 p.m. Citizens are invited to attend this meeting, ask questions and offer suggestions pertaining to the budget. The proposed tentative budget will be open to inspection at the office of the Board of Education for seven days prior to the Public Hearing."

PRESENTATION OF 1985/1986 BUDGET:

Mr. Restaino made comments with regard to the proposed 1985/1986 budget, and then each Board member in attendance, as well as Mr. DeCesare, Dr. Fadule and Mr. Ramsland made statements with regard to the budget, all stating that they support the budget as being fiscally responsible, and educationally sound. Mr. Restaino then opened the meeting for questions from the floor.

ADOPTING BUDGET FOR THE 1985/1986 SCHOOL YEAR:

Mr. Kucinski presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Baratta. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted.

WHEREAS, the proposed tentative budget for the 1985/1986 school year has been properly published in the local newspaper and adequately presented to the public at this budget hearing,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley hereby adopts the budget for the 1985/1986 school year in the following amounts:

Current Expense	\$16,005,890
Debt Services	<u>142,856</u>
TOTAL BUDGET	\$16,148,746

CALLING REFERENDUM:

Mr. Kucinski presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Malanga. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted.

WHEREAS, for the school year ending June 30, 1986, the expenditures for administration, instruction, attendance and health services, transportation, operation of plant, maintenance of plant, equipment, fixed charges, food services, student body activities, community services, and special State and Federal programs, requires that there be raised by local taxation the sum of \$12,729,740,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That at the Annual Meeting of the legal voters of the school district to be held on Tuesday, April 2, 1985 for the election of three members to the Board of Education for a term of three years, there be submitted the question of voting taxes to support the 1985/1986 budget as follows:

Current Expense                      \$12,729,740

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Board of Education be and is hereby directed to post notices on each school house in the District and at the following named public places, to wit: Town Hall, The Nutley Sun Office, Lardier Pharmacy, Inc., Gary's Pharmacy, Little's Pharmacy, Fred's Party Shop, and Griffith Shade Shop, calling said meeting in the Franklin, Washington, Lincoln, Yantacaw, Spring Garden and Radcliffe Schoolhouses; and that the boundaries of the sections of the school district, the voters of which shall be entitled to vote at the respective polling places, be as herein designated:

Lincoln School	<u>Polling District No. 1</u> Ward 1 - Districts 1, 2, & 7	Yantacaw School	<u>Polling District No. 4</u> Ward 2 - Districts 1, 5, & 6

Franklin School	<u>Polling District No. 3</u> Ward 1 - Districts 3, 4, & 5	Washington School	<u>Polling District No. 6</u> Ward 3 - Districts 1, 2, 6, & 7
	<u>Polling District No. 7</u> Spring Garden School Ward 2 - Districts 2, 3, & 4		

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the polls be open on Tuesday, April 2, 1985 between the hours of 2:30 and 9:00 p.m.
