Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey June 23, 1986

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, June 23, 1986, at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF ADEQUATE NOTICE:

Mr. Kucinski read the following:

"As required by the 'Open Public Meetings Act' (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975), notice of this meeting was provided to the public and the press at least 48 hours in advance. Said notice was:

- Mailed or delivered to The Nutley Sun, the Newark Star Ledger, the Passaic Herald News, and the Nutley Journal, and
- Delivered to the Nutley Township Clerk."

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Restaino leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Dr. Anthony N. Baratta, Mr. Sam Battaglia, Mr. Frank V. Hermo, Mr. Charles J. Piro, Mr. Gerard T. Restaino, Mr. Robert J. Rusignuolo, and Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel. Mr. Joseph L. Malanga arrived at 8:15 p.m. Twenty citizens were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on May 28, 1986 at 8:15 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Dr. Baratta moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mrs. Scheckel, and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following communications:

1. A letter from Sig Bogdanowicz, President, Veterans' Council of Nutley:

"On behalf of the Nutley Veterans' Council, may I offer our sincere thanks to you, Mr. Gino Giua and your entire staff for the fine cooperation which we received on Memorial Day. It was a job well done under the circumstances.

"Again many thanks to all your staff."

2. A letter from Octavius T. Reid, Jr., Administrator, New Jersey School Boards Association Insurance Group:

"On behalf of the Board of Trustees of the New Jersey School Boards Association Insurance Group, we are pleased to present your Board with the enclosed dividend check for \$8,780. The check is evidence of both the success of your Board in controlling losses, and of the Group as a whole in demonstrating the advantages of insurance pooling for school districts.

"The New Jersey School Boards Association Insurance Group has accomplished a great deal in its first two years of operation. The current commercial insurance market - with the decreased capacity and greatly increased prices - was the type of situation that precipitated the New Jersey School Boards Association's efforts for passage of the school board insurance group statute and the formation of our Group. Mr. Kucinski presented and read the following communication:

4. A letter from Mr. Douglas J. Harrison informing the Board that his son Douglas, an eighth grade student, had received a scholarship to The Hotchkiss School in Connecticut for the fall, and thanking the Board for providing an excellent education for his son.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented and read the following report:

"This is my 168th and final report to the Nutley Board of Education. I've reported to you good news and bad news. We have been together through good years and lean years. We have been three times rejected by the voters. More importantly, we have received voter approval eleven of the fourteen years. We have sailed through stormy seas and calm. In retrospect, from my point of view, these fourteen years have been good. I would like to sincerely thank the Board of Education, present and past, for all their kindness, understanding, assistance, and most of all, friendship.

"During the past month in the area of maintenance, 44 items of carpentry and general repairs were made, 12 lights of glass replaced, and 21 items of plumbing and heating repairs were made.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Mr. Ramsland presented the financial report as of May 31, 1986, showing total funds available of \$16,345,569.05, contractual orders to date of \$14,996,809.52, leaving a cash balance of \$1,348,759.53.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER OF SCHOOL MONEYS:

Mr. Ramsland presented the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys as of May 31, 1986, showing total receipts of \$15,142,001.70, cash expenditures of \$14,596,691.68, leaving a cash balance of \$545,310.02.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Fadule presented and read the following report:

"Please note the attached student enrollment information as of May 30, 1986.

"Please note the attached information pertaining to testing results.

"As usual the end-of-year activities provide for very busy and meaningful experiences."

Dr. Fadule explained the requirements that must be passed for a student to obtain a diploma and discussed the test results of the High School Proficiency Test.

CAFETERIA REPORT:

Mr. Hermo presented the cafeteria report as of May 31, 1986, showing a cash balance as of July 1, 1986 of \$1,588.95, total receipts of \$263,953.79, total disbursements of \$263,088.21, leaving a cash balance of \$2,454.53. Total "A" lunch - 14,238. Total milk sold - 13,262.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:

Mr. Kucinski, Chairman of the Negotiations Committee, reported on the status of contract negotiations with the Education Association of Nutley, adding that negotiations have reached an impasse.

Mr. Kucinski stated that the committees hope to meet throughout the summer as often as necessary to reach a settlement.

HEARING OF CITIZENS:

Mrs. Fran Homer, 20 Duncan Place, expressed her concerns with regard to the selection of the captain and co-captain for twirlers - no outside judges were used and no personal interviews were given. Mr. Kucinski replied that the Board was just recently made aware of this problem and would look into it. Dr. Fadule added that this would be looked into very carefully.

Mr. Piro questioned if the policy was changed this year, to which Mrs. Homer replied that there was an amendment this year. Dr. Fadule stated that the amendment would be looked into to determine how it came about.

Mrs. Joyce Schweikert, 110 Satterthwaite Avenue, expressed her dissatisfaction with the timing of the posting of the test results for twirlers. This was done right before exams. Mr. Kucinski replied that the situation would be investigated.

Mr. Malanga thanked Mrs. Homer for attending the meeting, adding that the situation would be checked out, and what is necessary to be done will be done.

Mr. Piro asked Dr. Fadule to explain what part the new Band Director played in this situation, and Dr. Fadule responded that he was asked to be a judge on the spur of the moment.

Mrs. Joan Rubino, 48 North Road, asked if there was an answer to the question she asked last month regarding funds spent at the high school, to which Mr. Kucinski replied that Mr. Piro will get her the answer. Mrs. Rubino replied that she would like the answer publicly, adding that the answer should have been available the day the question was asked.

Mrs. Elaine Karsnak, 70 Mapes Avenue, expressed her feelings with regard to the cheerleading program, citing the lack of continuity with advisors, and the fact that cheerleading is not considered a sport. Mr. Kucinski replied that it is now a coaching position, and the Board is looking into bringing on a permanent, tenured teacher as cheerleading coach. Mr. Piro commented that he feels Mrs. Karsnak will see some positive changes and a different attitude toward cheerleading, and feels there will be no further problems. Mr. Battaglia and Mr. Malanga also made comments regarding the cheerleading program and the positive steps that will be taken. Dr. Fadule added that this is an ideal time to review these things as there is a new Band Director.

Mrs. Sera T. Shuster, 462 Chestnut Street, asked for an explanation as to how The Nutley Sun was able to announce the appointment of Dr. Votto as Assistant Superintendent of Schools when the resolution is only being acted upon this evening. She further added that the announcement was also made at the Third Half Club dinner. Dr. Fadule explained that because of time constraints, after Dr. Votto's appointment had been approved by the Board in closed session, approval was given to post the notice of the vacancy in the position of high school principal.

Mrs. Shuster stated that several months ago she had asked what the Board intended to do in memory of Mrs. Adele Jaworek, and asked if anything had been decided upon. Mr. Kucinski replied that the Board had not had time to consider the matter. Mr. Rusignuolo commented that there have been numerous people who served on the Board and not everyone is remembered in an extra special way. When they leave they are given parties and tokens of personal appreciation but it is not consistent with past practice to honor her in a way that may seem satisfactory to everyone.

Mrs. Shuster then commented that Mr. Hrbek was an excellent Band Director whose bands always sounded good, and he was a gentleman like Mr. Ramsland.
