The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, December 15, 1986 at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., President, presiding.

#### CAFETERIA REPORT:

Mr. Hermo presented the cafeteria report as of November 30, 1986, showing a cash balance as of July 1, 1986 of \$251.65, total receipts of \$93,901.46, total disbursements of \$94,956.29, leaving a cash balance of (\$803.18). Total "A" lunch - 11,091. Total milk sold - 8,144.

#### REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:

Mrs. Scheckel reported that she had attended the New Jersey School Boards Association Delegates' Assembly on Saturday, December 13, 1986. She distributed copies of a tally of the votes taken. Mrs. Scheckel further reported on emergency resolutions which were also introduced. One would keep the high school requirements for one year of fine/performing arts, and this was amended and approved. Another resolution would keep the high school requirements for onehalf year of career education. This was approved. A third resolution would require school election ballots to be mailed to all registered voters, and costs would be exempt from caps. This was also approved. The final emergency resolution would move the High School Proficiency Test to 8th grade and coordinate curriculum and remediation between sending and receiving districts. This was referred to committee, and will be voted on in June. Mr. Restaino expressed his concern regarding this resolution since 9th grade items appear on the HSPT.
