Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey October 26, 1987

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey, was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, October 26, 1987 at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Frank V. Hermo, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Mr. Hermo read the following:

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Kucinski leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Dr. Anthony N. Baratta, Mr. Sam P. Battaglia, Mrs. Sally Goodson, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., Mr. Charles J. Piro, Mr. Gerard T. Restaino, Mr. Robert J. Rusignuolo and Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel. Approximately 28 citizens were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on September 28, 1987 at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mrs. Scheckel moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Kucinski, and unanimously approved by the Board.

CAFETERIA REPORT:

Mr. Battaglia presented the cafeteria report as of September 30, 1987 showing a cash balance as of July 1, 1987 of (\$3,454.16), total receipts of \$29,124.64, total disbursements of \$21,600.13, leaving a cash balance of \$4,070.35. Total "A" lunch - 10,104. Total milk sold - 8,617.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mr. Kucinski, Chairman of the Facilities Committee, reported that letters were sent to Mrs. Goodson and Mr. Piro concerning the review of the declining enrollment. Mrs. Goodson would contact the principals and P.T.A. presidents to arrange to go into the schools and take a look at the facilities with regard to the amount of rooms available in each school. Mr. Kucinski added that Mr. Piro would be contacting Mr. Sincaglia to look into the birth rate in Nutley. After that, Mr. Kucinski would arrange a meeting of the Committee to discuss the declining enrollment situation.

Mr. Hermo questioned the make-up of the Committee. Mr. Kucinski responded that the Committee would consist of himself, Mrs. Goodson, Mr. Piro, Mr. Restaino, the P.T.A. presidents of all schools as well as the administration and principals of the schools.

HEARING OF CITIZENS (Resolutions Only):

Mrs. Joan Rubino, 48 North Road, questioned what had been done by the teachers for the expenditure of \$3,208 as listed for HSPT Interpretation on Resolution #13. Dr. Votto responded that this is a State-mandated program whereby the district must analyze the most recent results of the High School Proficiency Test. He added that the teachers worked after school and on Saturday.

Mrs. Rubino then asked what the work entailed. Dr. Votto replied that the teachers look at the tests to see where the students have shown strengths or deficiencies, and then relate their findings to the faculty.

Mrs. Rubino questioned why the position of Languages Department Chairperson is being abolished with regard to Resolution #14. Dr. Fadule explained that Resolutions #14, #15 and #16 are all related. Resolution #15 establishes a position of Language Arts Coordinator. This position does not exist in the district at present. He further explained that two years ago, the district established the position of Math Coordinator, which is a K-12 position, with most of the emphasis being on Grades 7-12. The Coordinator's position differed from the previous position of High School Math Department Chairman. It was thought that the Coordinator position proved to be quite successful, and this was compared with the situation which existed in the English Department and Foreign Language Department in the high school. When the Language Department Chairman retired, the concept of a Languages Department Chairperson was tried. It was hoped it would be educationally sound and cost effective; however, it has not been as effective as was hoped. Dr. Fadule further explained that tonight's action would eliminate the combined position and would create a new position called Language Arts Coordinator.

Mrs. Rubino questioned if this position would be similar to the position of Math Coordinator. Dr. Fadule replied that the Language Arts Coordinator would have responsibility for Grades 7-12, the teachers' curriculum, which the administration feels would improve articulation. The Coordinator would also be available to the elementary schools on an as-needed basis.

BILLS AND MANDATORY PAYMENTS:

Mr. Battaglia presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mrs. Scheckel. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

ABOLISHING POSITION - Languages Department Chairperson:

Mr. Rusignuolo presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mrs. Scheckel. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Nutley Board of Education abolish the position of Department Chairperson of the Languages Department, effective June 30, 1988.

Dr. Fadule reiterated that this position was created several years ago, combining the Foreign Languages and English Department. That position will continue until the end of this year, and then it will be abolished.

ESTABLISHING POSITION - Language Arts Coordinator:

Mr. Rusignuolo presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Battaglia. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education establish the position of Language Arts Coordinator, effective July 1, 1988.

Dr. Fadule explained that this is the position we are creating. He added that this position would involve all of the English programs in Grades 7-12 and language arts in Grades K-12. Dr. Fadule further added that this position will go into effect on July 1, 1988. This concept is based on the Math Coordinator's position created in the recent past which improved articulation throughout the grades and was more beneficial to the students.

Dr. Baratta questioned if both positions would involve evaluating teachers, to which Dr. Fadule replied in the affirmative, adding that it would deal with teachers in those departments.

ESTABLISHING POSITION - High School Foreign Language Department Chairperson:

Mrs. Goodson presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Dr. Baratta. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education establish the position of High School Foreign Language Department Chairperson, effective July 1, 1988.

Dr. Fadule explained that when the Languages Department Chairperson position is abolished, this would leave the foreign languages people without any supervision. This resolution creates a supervisory position for the Foreign Language Department which is strictly the high school.

SPECIAL CLASS PLACEMENT - Atypical Students:

Mrs. Goodson presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Rusignuolo. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

HEARING OF CITIZENS:

Mr. Charles Appel, President of the Academic Booster Club, read the following statement:

"The Academic Booster Club is an organization founded five years ago to promote greater interest in and support for our educational system.

"The Executive Board of the Academic Booster Club would at this time like to express its support for the alpha kindergarten curriculum that is presently being used in the Nutley Public Schools.

"Until the 1960's kindergartens served as a transition between home and school. Children learned to work with unfamiliar adults, get along with other children, and adjust to the routine of school. Traditional kindergartens also aimed to convey a variety of kinds of common knowledge and to develop general social, physical and intellectual skills. Nutley's kindergarten still serves these functions but in addition there is a systematic introduction to reading skills.

"We have confidence in the curriculum development committee that developed this program and the staff which administers it. We are also in agreement with the current Board of Education policy which calls for periodic review and revitilization of all curricula."

OLD BUSINESS:

NEW BUSINESS:

Mrs. Scheckel reported that the high school band performed last night in the 41st Annual Band Festival in Montclair State College stadium. She added that over 1,000 students from various schools participated. Nutley's rooting section was the best she had ever heard. She added that they were very supportive, and the children did splendidly. Mrs. Scheckel added that when the judges did the critique, they used words such as "splendid" and "dramatic." Mrs. Scheckel commented that she was very proud of the high school band.

Mr. Hermo stated that anyone having attended football games would have noticed the dramatic change in the overall performance of the students in the band. It has been very enjoyable. Mr. Hermo requested that Dr. Fadule convey the Board's congratulations to Mr. D'Angelo, Band Director.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Board, on motion made by Mr. Battaglia, seconded by Mrs. Scheckel, the meeting was adjourned at 8:32 p.m.
