The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, June 27, 1988 at 8:00 p.m. with Dr. Anthony N. Baratta, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Dr. Baratta read the following:

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mrs. Goodson leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

#### RECESS MEETING:

Dr. Baratta declared a short recess at 8:18 p.m.

#### RECONVENE MEETING:

Dr. Baratta reconvened the meeting at 8:21 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on May 23, 1988 at 8:00 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Kucinski moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Rusignuolo, and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Sincaglia presented and read the following communications:

1. A notice from the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association regarding an annual assessment on all member districts for its building expansion. The assessment will amount to \$425 each year for the next ten years.
2. Letters from Mrs. Peggy Windheim, President, Yantacaw Mothers Club and Miss Mary Flannery, Yantacaw School teacher, complimenting members of the transportation staff for their fine work regarding field trips for Yantacaw School.
3. A letter from Mr. Nicholas P. Grande, Varsity Baseball Coach, Belleville High School, expressing his compliments for the excellent playing condition of the Oval in spite of the adverse weather conditions.
4. A notice from the Essex County Educational Services Commission regarding a meeting scheduled for June 23, 1988 which was rescheduled for an earlier date.
5. A notice from the New Jersey School Boards Association regarding dues assessment for 1988-89. The dues were expected to increase 18%, which the New Jersey School Boards Association recognized as excessive, and the Association was able to adopt a budget which requires an increase in dues of just under 8%.
6. A notice from a property owner at 187 Washington Avenue regarding building of a second floor office area and handwork bindery. Mr. Sincaglia stated that this would have no impact on our properties.
7. A thank you letter for the Board's expression of condolence from the Saporito family.
8. A notice from the Essex County Educational Services Commission regarding a meeting scheduled for June 21, 1988 which was rescheduled for a later date.
9. A notice from a property owner at 27 Forest Avenue regarding building of a rear house dormer. Mr. Sincaglia stated that this would have no impact on our properties.

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10. A letter from the American Dairy Association and Dairy Council, Inc. regarding Nutley High School's Photography II - Period 8 class being selected winner of a poster contest. Mr. Sincaglia praised Linda Scarpa, Cafeteria Director and Carl Ohlson, photography teacher, for their initiative in entering this contest. He added that this poster would appear in virtually every junior and senior high school in New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania during the 1988-89 school year.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Secretary as of May 31, 1988. (See attached report.)

#### TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys as of May 31, 1988. (See attached report.)

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Fadule reported that the High School Proficiency Test and Iowa test scores were exceptionally good. He announced the following HSPT scores: Reading - 99.6%. He explained that for the second consecutive year, only one youngster did not pass the test. Writing - 98.3%. Dr. Fadule commented that this score had gone up considerably. Math - 95.8%. Dr. Fadule stated that he is investigating the possibility that two special education youngsters had taken the test and should not have done so. If this did happen, the math results would be higher than reported.

Dr. Fadule stated that he had attended every graduation in the district and was pleased with the youngsters' deportment. He added that this was a most positive experience.

Dr. Fadule stated that once again this summer, many different programs would be held including summer school, open gym, music and summer enrichment. He added that most of the central office's time is spent preparing for September and dealing with personnel and curriculum matters.

Mr. Sincaglia reported that the business office is closing out the fiscal records of the district and preparing for the annual audit. Many State and Federal reports must be completed, and the new computer system would be producing our records as of July 1. He added that summer projects included reroofing of Yantacaw School, removal of asbestos at Franklin School, boiler work at Lincoln School as well as routine maintenance work. Also, projects would be identified for short and long-range planning to be addressed during the year or for the next budget cycle.
