Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey

November 27, 1989

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, November 27, 1989 at 8:02 p.m., with Dr. Anthony N. Baratta, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Dr. Baratta read the following:

"According to the provisions of the 'Open Public Meetings Act' (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975), proper notice of this Regular Meeting of the Board was provided in the Annual Notice of April 10, 1989. Said Notice was:

"Formal action will be taken."

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Battaglia leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mr. Sam P. Battaglia, Mrs. Sally Goodson, Mr. Frank V. Hermo, Mrs. Aileen Hresko, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., Mr. Robert J. Rusignuolo and Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel. Absent: Mr. Charles J. Piro. Approximately 35 citizens were present.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS:

Dr. Fadule stated that our district has taken a stand on academic excellence and high standards for everyone because it is believed that this is the best way to serve our young people. He said that this evening we are honoring students who have distinguished themselves by attaining National Merit Scholarship Program status. Dr. Fadule then introduced Mr. John Jacone, principal of Nutley High School.

Mr. Jacone, on behalf of the teachers at Nutley High School and himself, congratulated the students. He commented that these students are not only academicians, but are the finest young people the high school has. They are involved in all kinds of activities and do an excellent job in all phases of high school life. Mr. Jacone then introduced Mr. Paul McCarthy, Director of Guidance.

Mr. McCarthy explained that Commended students must score in the top 5% of the students taking the test, and a Semi-Finalist must score in the top half of 1%.

Dr. Baratta commended all the students on behalf of the Board of Education.

RECESS MEETING:

Dr. Baratta recessed the meeting at 8:11 p.m.

RECONVENE MEETING:

Dr. Baratta reconvened the meeting at 8:13 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on October 23, 1989 at 8:03 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Kucinski moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Rusignuolo, and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Sincaglia presented and read the following communications:

- 1. A thank-you note from the James Cummings family for the Board's expression of condolence.
- 2. A letter from Dr. Virginia Brinson, Interim Essex County Superintendent of Schools, approving the district's objectives and action plans for the 1989-90 school year and indicating that they would be reviewed during the year to see if the district met its goals.
- 3. A letter from Mr. Donald R. Heerwig concerning Policy #807 and Regulation #8070 on Child Abuse.
- 4. A letter from the Nutley Volunteer Emergency & Rescue Squad, Inc. thanking the Board for its cooperation in setting up a cadet program for the 1989-90 school year.
- 5. A notice from the Essex County School Boards Association of a meeting to be held on December 6, 1989 concerning Early Childhood Education and Dealing with the Media.
- 6. A letter from Assembly Majority Whip Elizabeth E. Randall responding to our letter expressing our concerns regarding the lack of a separate certificate for Early Childhood Education.
- 7. A letter from Assemblyman John V. Kelly responding to our concerns regarding an Early Childhood Education certificate.
- 8. A letter to Dr. Fadule from Capt. Frederick J. Scalera, Fire Official, thanking Dr. Votto, four high school boys, and Susan Davis, Transportation Coordinator, for the assistance they rendered during the tornado of November 16, 1989.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Secretary as of October 31, 1989. (See attached report.)

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys as of October 31, 1989. (See attached report.)

Mr. Sincaglia stated that with the recently completed audit for the 1988-89 fiscal year, there were no recommendations or citations that the Board must act upon. The accounts were

found to be kept in a satisfactory manner. Mr. Sincaglia indicated that his main concern is that the surplus is ever-declining and was under \$560,000 at the conclusion of the last school year.

Mr. Sincaglia expressed his appreciation to the members of his clerical and accounting staffs for their efforts resulting in a third consecutive year of having an audit free of errors or recommendations.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Fadule presented and read the following report:

"The Nutley High School Fall Sports Award Program will be conducted Tuesday, November 28, 7:30 p.m. in the high school auditorium.

"Elementary parent-teacher conferences will be conducted on Wednesday, November 29.

"Attached is the October 31, 1989 enrollment report."

Dr. Fadule reported that on Sunday, November 26, there was a fire in the attendance office of the high school, but the school is operating in a normal fashion even though the attendance process had to be moved. Dr. Fadule indicated that the fire department responded very quickly and efficiently, and they are investigating this incident together with the police department.

"Comments pertaining to the New Jersey School Report Cards."

Dr. Fadule distributed copies of Essex County and New Jersey Report Card Information (see attached), explaining that this material is a continuation of an article which appeared in the Sunday Star Ledger, written by Bob Braun.

Dr. Fadule explained that in New Jersey, all school districts are labeled on a letter continuum of A-J, based on demographic factors, most of which are socio-economic in nature, adding that A are generally urban districts and J are very wealthy, suburban districts. He further explained that this letter is called a District Factor Group, and Nutley is a G district.

Dr. Fadule commented that Nutley came in sixth on the SAT ranking in Essex County, and every one of the five districts ahead of us is in a higher District Factor Grouping. Nutley's cost per pupil is very low, which makes it very clear that we do very well in the achievement area and in terms of what we spend. He further commented that Nutley came in third in HSPT results in the county. Dr. Fadule stated that he also compared Nutley with some other G districts, not in Essex County, for whom he was able to obtain scores, and Nutley is the highest.

Dr. Fadule mentioned that he had been concerned because in the past three years, the budget had been defeated twice, but these figures show that we are very sound in terms of our cost per pupil in comparison with other districts. He added that these results will go out to teachers and supervisors, and he thanked them for jobs well done.

Mrs. Scheckel asked if Nutley is the only G district in Essex County, to which Dr. Fadule replied in the affirmative.

Dr. Baratta expressed his appreciation to Mr. Jacone for his outstanding concern with regard to the fire in the high school attendance office.

Dr. Baratta extended to Mr. Sincaglia and his excellent staff the Board's appreciation for an excellent audit report. Dr. Fadule commented that this is a tremendous accomplishment if it only happens once, but this is the third consecutive year with no citations whatsoever, which is even more impressive.

PROGRAM PLAN FOR THE EDUCATION OF ALL HANDICAPPED CHILDREN:

Dr. Fadule explained that Hoffmann-LaRoche gave out \$1,000 for each of those sixty years and divided the money between Clifton and Nutley. He added that it speaks well for Hoffmann-LaRoche and the value it holds for education. He further added that this money will be well spent.

APPROVAL OF CONTRACT - Asbestos Removal, Clean-up and Encapsulation - Yantacaw School:

Mr. Hermo presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mrs. Scheckel. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, in order to perform radon remediation work at the Yantacaw School, it was necessary to remove asbestos-containing material in otherwise inaccessible areas, and

WHEREAS, the Board has received proposals for such work.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board confirms the approval of a contract with Falcon Associates, Inc., Bristol, PA for asbestos removal, clean-up and encapsulation at the Yantacaw School in the amount of \$8,500.

WHEREAS, Mr. Zabriskie won the respect of all those with whom he came in contact for his dedication to the Nutley School District,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley extends deepest sympathy to the members of his family, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be made a part of the minutes of this meeting and a copy sent to the members of his family.

Dr. Fadule stated that he had never had the pleasure of working with Mr. Zabriskie, but he understands that Mr. Zabriskie had done a great deal for the district.

Dr. Baratta added that he, also, did not know Mr. Zabriskie but would like to express the Board's profound gratitude for his many contributions to the district.
