The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, June 25, 1990 at 8:00 p.m., with Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Mrs. Scheckel read the following:

"According to the provisions of the 'Open Public Meetings Act' (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975), proper notice of this Regular Meeting of the Board was provided in the Annual Notice of June 1, 1990. Said Notice was:

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Dr. Baratta leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Dr. Anthony N. Baratta, Mr. Sam P. Battaglia, Mr. Frank V. Hermo, Mrs. Aileen Hresko, Mr. Charles J. Piro and Mr. Robert J. Rusignuolo. (Mrs. Sally Goodson entered after roll call.) Absent: Mr. Charles W. Kucinski. Approximately thirty citizens were present.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS:

Mrs. Scheckel turned the program over to Dr. Fadule. Dr. Fadule stated that tonight we were honoring our youngsters in three different categories. All of these students have distinguished themselves, families and school. He particularly mentioned the photography awards which were done on a voluntary basis - showing the growth and development of these students. SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Secretary as of May 31, 1990. (See attached report.)

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys as of May 31, 1990. (See attached report.)

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Fadule presented and read the following report:

"Comments pertaining to the seven promotion and commencement exercises"

Dr Fadule commented that this year in terms of the elementary school promotions something different was attempted. All five elemen-

tary schools had their promotion on Tuesday, June 19, 1990 at 2:00 p.m. To date we have received good responses. The Board will be asked for an assessment of this to determine if it would be beneficial to continue this practice. Dr. Fadule did mention that there was a problem with the rain dates for the high school. Work will continue during the summer to arrive at a solution.

"Comments pertaining to the Central Office summer activities"

Dr. Fadule asked Dr. Votto to comment. Dr. Votto stated that this is a very busy place in terms of getting ready for the opening of school in September.

He mentioned that the Summer Enrichment Program will begin on July 2, for those youngsters in Grades 3, 4 and 5 for a period of four weeks. This is an annual basic skills program. The summer school program at the high school will begin on June 25, 1990 and run for six weeks.

Band camp will be held one week in August.

"Comments pertaining to the Business Office activities"

Mr. Sincaglia commented that his office is very busy. He reported on the removal of four oil tanks. A total of five tanks will be removed this year. He was very pleased that they were removed without any contamination. Presently three asbestos projects are going on in Spring Garden School, Lincoln School and Washington School. Also, several schools are being considered for gas installation. Mr. Sincaglia mentioned that Mr. Stasi and his staff are working on many projects to prepare for the December monitoring. The students hired for summer projects seem to be well experienced in their duties.

CAFETERIA REPORT:

Mr. Battaglia presented the cafeteria report as of May 31, 1990, showing a cash balance as of July 1, 1989 of (4,262.78), total receipts of \$323,908.59, total disbursements of \$311,380.30, leaving a cash balance of \$8,265.51. Total "A" lunch - 13,744. Total milk sold - 8,113.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mrs. Sally Goodson reported on the P.T.A. project at Lincoln School. A committee of parents met for the purpose of initiating a before school and after school program at Lincoln. The parents of students presently enrolled as well as the new kindergarten entries were given a questionnaire to complete. In the next two weeks the questionnaires will be gathered and the need will be determined.

Mrs. Scheckel asked if this was for all schools to which Mrs. Goodson replied that it was only a pilot program for Lincoln School.

Mr. Piro reported that the athletic committee met on June 11, 1990 and eighteen applications were reviewed for head football coach.

After interviewing the three finalists it was decided to appoint Mr. Richard SanFillipo as head football coach. Mr. SanFillipo comes to Nutley with a very fine record.

Dr. Fadule reported that a recommendation had been made to the Board for the science position at Franklin School.
