The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, December 17, 1990 at 8:02 p.m., with Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Mrs. Scheckel read the following:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Kucinski leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mrs. Scheckel indicated that she had received information on the upcoming National School Boards Association convention to be held in San Francisco in April, and she requested that Mr. Sincaglia prepare copies of the information for Mr. Battaglia, Mrs. Goodson and Mr. Hermo.

Mrs. Hresko mentioned that she had attended the Hoffmann-LaRoche grant program at the high school, adding that it was an excellent preschool program. She stated that Barbara Hirsch had done an excellent job. Dr. Fadule commented that Hoffmann-La Roche had donated \$30,000 each to Clifton and Nutley in honor of its sixtieth anniversary, and Mayor Kelly had appointed him to a commission to determine how Nutley's money would be distributed. Mrs. Goodson commented that she would have liked to attend the program.

Mr. Battaglia mentioned that the wrestling team won the Kearny tournament and had done a fine job.

Dr. Baratta stated that he felt that an activity such as the Hoffmann-LaRoche grant program should not have to wait for the donation of monies, adding that the district should see that such programs are offered for parents who are interested. Dr. Fadule responded that the grant was seed money, and the district is obligated to follow up on that.
