The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, January 28, 1991 at 8:05 p.m., with Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel, President, presiding.

The meeting was opened with Mr. Piro leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

The meeting resumed at 8:30 p.m.

## APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on December 17, 1990 at 8:02 p.m., being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Piro moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Battaglia and unanimously approved by the Board.

# COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Sincaglia presented and read the following communications:

- 1. A thank-you note from Albert Thibault for the Board's expression of condolences on the death of his mother.
- 2. A letter from Peter E. Carter, Essex County Superintendent of Schools, indicating his recommendation to the Commissioner of Education that the district be certified after the monitoring review.
- 3. A resolution from the Newton Board of Education urging elimination of mandated membership in the New Jersey School Boards Association.
- A notice from the Essex County School Boards Association proposing revisions to its Bylaws and a notice of a general meeting to be held on January 31 dealing with budget passage.

- 5. Letters from the Nutley Music Boosters Association, the Nutley High School Parents' Council and the Radcliffe School P.T.A. asking support of a summer music program this year.
- 6. A thank-you letter from The Friends of The Nutley Public Library for the donation of \$112 in proceeds raised through a performance of The Theatre Workshop under the direction of Ms. Thomasina Hyland during the 1989-90 school year.

# SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Secretary as of December 31, 1990. (See attached report.)

# TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys as of December 31, 1990. (See attached report.)

Mr. Sincaglia mentioned that the dates of the school election and the release of State aid figures are still unknown. He added that there is doubt that the election will be held in April, and things are at a standstill.

# SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Fadule presented and read the following report:

"Informational Items

"Second quarter report cards will be distributed on Friday, February 1, 1991.

"The implementation of our priorities is progressing quite well and reports to the Board are forthcoming over the next several months.

"Comments pertaining to the February 4th articulation day - Dr. Votto."

Dr. Votto indicated that February 4 would be a onesession day for all students; however, every faculty member and administrator would meet in grade level, department or committee meetings to review implementation of curriculum. Dr. Votto thanked the Board for the opportunity for this district-wide articulation. He added that the district was commended by the State monitors on this program, and we look forward to another fine program.

"Comments pertaining to the New Jersey Cost of Education Index - Mr. Sincaglia."

Mr. Sincaglia explained how the cost of education is determined and announced that for 1989-90, Nutley's cost of education was \$5,731 per pupil, the state average was \$6,348 per pupil or \$617 more than Nutley. The county average was \$6,653 per pupil, \$922 more than Nutley. North Jersey K-12 districts with enrollments between 3,000 and 5,999 pupils had an average of \$6,941 per pupil or \$1,210 more than Nutley's expenditure.

Mr. Sincaglia explained that if Nutley spent at the average in the county last year, we would have spent an additional 3 million dollars, and we should take pride in knowing that academically and fiscally, the district remains on the right track.

"Comments pertaining to educational trips"

Dr. Fadule recommended that the Board rescind its approval for educational trips to Europe this spring in light of recent events and that it strongly advise parents to consider the safety risks before allowing their child to travel to Europe. He added that such trips would not be under the auspices of the Board of Education.

Mr. Battaglia moved that the Board withdraw its support for educational trips to Europe this spring, seconded by Mr. Kucinski and unanimously approved by the Board.

WHEREAS, the low bid of Hannon Floor Covering Corp. appears to meet all specifications,

Dr. Baratta stated that it has been a privilege for him to serve on the Board of Education, and he thanked the citizens who had supported his candidacy. He also thanked his colleagues on the Board, both past and present, the teachers and principals for their good will, and the central administration and his family, especially his wife, for their support.

Dr. Baratta then announced that he would not be a candidate for re-election to the Board.

Mrs. Scheckel indicated that she was very sorry to hear his announcement.
