The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, June 24, 1991 at 8:03 p.m., with Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Mrs. Scheckel read the following:

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mrs. Goodson leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mr. Sam P. Battaglia, Mrs. Sally Goodson, Mr. John G. Griwert, Mr. Frank V. Hermo, Mrs. Aileen Hresko, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., Mr. Charles J. Piro and Mr. Robert J. Rusignuolo. Approximately 15 citizens were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on May 28, 1991 at 8:04 p.m. being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Griwert moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Battaglia and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Sincaglia presented and read the following communications:

1. A notice from the Essex County Educational Services Commission of the regular meeting of the Board of Directors to be held June 6, 1991. Additionally, the Board of Directors scheduled their reorganization meeting for June 6, 1991 at 7:00 p.m.
2. Mrs. Scheckel asked Mr. Sincaglia to read into the record a letter from Mr. Joseph C. Pelaia that he had written to the Nutley Sun and requested be part of the public meeting.

"Dear Editor:

"A few weeks ago the front page of your newspaper carried a lead article under a headline concerning teachers salaries in Nutley. It was reported that one member of the Township's Planning Board, NOT Board of Education, had drafted a breakdown of teachers' salaries.

"Of particular interest to me was his assertion that the 'lowest salary paid to a teacher in the Nutley system for the 1990-91 year was \$29,129', when, in fact, approximately a dozen teachers in Nutley earn less than this amount. Much more troubling to me was his contention that 'any teacher from a certified program would be well qualified' to teach in our schools. ANY teacher? I think not!! Merely meeting certain minimum standards for state licensing should not be the standard upon which our teachers are hired. Nor should we in the interests of short-sighted economy, vie with the worst school system in the state for candidates.

"Like taxpayers everywhere, I too want taxes at all levels of government kept as low as possible. In this regard, the Nutley school system has one of the lowest costs per pupil while the children have achieved some of the highest test scores in the county.

"As we travel about town it is sometimes easy to view our brick and mortar school buildings as our school

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system. However, it is an inescapable fact that the foundation of any educational system is the faculty we employ to educate our children. Of course, we should expect a great deal from our teachers. The simple fact of the matter, however, is that we must hire and retain quality teachers if our children are to achieve their highest potential.

"I would strongly urge the Board of Education and Administration not to abandon their current philosophy of selecting teaching candidates based on quality.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Secretary as of May 31, 1991. (See attached report.)

Mr. Sincaglia reported on the bids that had been received for the sale of \$1,985,000 in Temporary Notes on June 19, 1991. The bid has been awarded to Midlantic National Bank at their low bid rate of 4.82%. (Copy of bids received is attached.)

The Board was very pleased with the rates inasmuch as the previous notes we had issued were at rates of 6.16% and 6.27% which were good rates at the time they were issued.

#### TREASURERS' REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys as of May 31, 1991. (See attached report.)

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Fadule presented and read the following report:

"Comments pertaining to the seven promotion and commencement exercises"

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Dr. Fadule commented that the elementary school exercises went well. They were well attended and proceeded in a fine manner.

The Franklin School promotion went well. After an attempt to have the exercises outdoors everyone went inside, and the graduation continued.

The high school graduation did not go well. The Board will set up a committee to study and analyze the situation and make sure the same thing does not recur next year.

"Comments pertaining to Central Office summer activities"

Dr. Fadule stated that this is a very busy time in terms of getting ready for the opening of school in September. The office is very busy with summer school for the high school, Franklin School, Special Education summer program and the Summer Enrichment Program.

Dr. Fadule also commented on another program, "Lets Learn" the Academic Booster Club program taking place at Franklin School, though not sponsored by the Board of Education is part of the summer activities.

"Comments pertaining to the Business Office activities"

Mr. Sincaglia commented on the asbestos removal project. It will be proceeding at the high school and a limited project at Yantacaw.

The oil storage tank was removed at Yantacaw with no contamination.

Roofing work will be taking place at Spring Garden, Lincoln and Franklin Schools.

The maintenance staff will be very busy this summer moving people from the high school, and when the asbestos work is completed, moving them back.

"Miscellaneous informational items"

Dr. Fadule reported Mr. Rusignuolo was re-elected as President of Essex County School Boards Association. Also, Mr. Sincaglia was elected president of the the Essex County Association of School Business Officials.

Dr. Fadule reported that the Achievement scores were very pleasing. On the High School Proficiency Test scores we received 100% in Reading, 98.4% in Mathematics and 98.9% in Writing. The Iowa Test scores were also very impressive. This shows that the children, teachers and administrators are all doing a great job.

Mr. Piro questioned what the enrollment numbers are for the class that started when the kindergarten registration date changed.

#### CAFETERIA REPORT:

Mr. Battaglia presented the cafeteria report as of May 31, 1991, showing a cash balance as of July 1, 1991 of (5,483.68), total receipts of \$332,246.78, total disbursements of \$303,297.22, leaving a cash balance of \$23,465.88. Total "A" lunch - 12,433. Total milk sold - 7,852.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mr. Kucinski thanked the Negotiations Committee for their work on different negotiations that had taken place in the past few months. He also thanked Miss Ro Tangorra and her committee and felt that they had come up with an equitable pay raise.

Mr. Piro thanked Mr. Kucinski for an excellent job as Chairman of the Negotiations Committee. Mrs. Scheckel also thanked Mr. Kucinski.

#### HEARING OF CITIZENS (Resolutions Only):

Mrs. Joan Rubino, 48 North Road, raised a question about why principals were paid to chair committees on Saturdays. Mrs. Rubino further commented that she felt principals should not be paid

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for this service. Mrs. Scheckel responded that it is a negotiated part of administrators contracts.

Mr. Sig Bogdanowicz, 208 Alexander Avenue, asked a question regarding the percent of money in the teachers three year contract. Mr. Kucinski responded that new money to the district for three years was a 6.25% increase. The new money is the salary guide representing 6.25% and there were other items also agreed to.

Mr. Bogdanowicz stated that part of the medical costs should be paid by teachers. Mr. Kucinski responded that an attempt was made to negotiate for teachers to pick up part of the cost but that Nutley would be first in the county to do so.

Mrs. Scheckel stated that, by law, the Board of Education must pay the employees' portion of medical costs.

Mrs. Sera Shuster, 462 Chestnut Street, had a question regarding an item on the bill list, to which Mr. Sincaglia responded.

Mrs. Goodson presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Rusignuolo. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education approves Change Order #1 in the contract for roof restoration work with the Barrett Company in the amount of \$11,800.

APPROVAL OF OFFICIAL STATEMENT - \$1,985,000 Temporary Notes:

Mr. Rusignuolo presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Griwert. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, The Board of Education of the Township of Nutley in the County of Essex, New Jersey has heretofore authorized the issuance of temporary notes to finance various capital projects, and

WHEREAS, the Secretary/Business Administrator has been authorized to sell the temporary notes from time to time as he deems necessary, and



WHEREAS, an Official Statement has been prepared in connection with the sale of \$1,985,000 Temporary Notes dated July 2, 1991 (the "notes"),

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley in the County of Essex, New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Official Statement prepared in preliminary form and distributed in connection with the sale of the Notes is hereby approved. The appropriate representatives of the School District are authorized to prepare the Official Statement in final form and to make a reasonable number of copies available to the purchaser of the Notes. The Secretary/Business Administrator is authorized to execute the Official Statement and any necessary certificates in connection with the Official Statement on behalf of the School District.
2. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

#### HEARING OF CITIZENS:

Mrs. Joan Rubino, 48 North Road, asked a question regarding a statement in the Nutley Sun that teachers receive thirty-five sick days. Mrs. Scheckel responded commenting that it was misinformation and that teachers receive ten sick days a year.

Mrs. Angie D'Agostino, 79 Myrtle Avenue, thanked the Board of Education for providing her child with a good education. She wanted to commend the work of Mr. Louis San Giovanni who had a great influence on her child. She stressed that art is a very important part of education and wanted the Board and the community to know what a fine job Mr. San Giovanni is doing. Mrs. Scheckel thanked her, and Mr. Jacone, principal of Nutley High School, said that he would let Mr. San Giovanni know of her comments.

Mrs. Rubino had a question regarding an SAT class that would be introduced into the curriculum in the fall. Mr. Jacone, Nutley High School principal, responded. He stated that after checking with various schools, Nutley decided they would introduce the course on a trial basis. It would be a full year, five credit SAT course consisting of verbal and math programs.

After students' SAT scores are available, the course would be evaluated. If it was found to be helpful, the course would continue and be expanded.

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Mrs. Marilyn Heider, 3 Whitford Avenue, had several questions regarding items on the bill list, to which Mr. Sincaglia responded.

Mrs. D'Agostino commented on Project Graduation, stating that it was a wonderful evening and that the Board should encourage and support future classes in this endeavor.

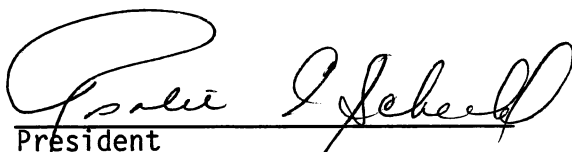

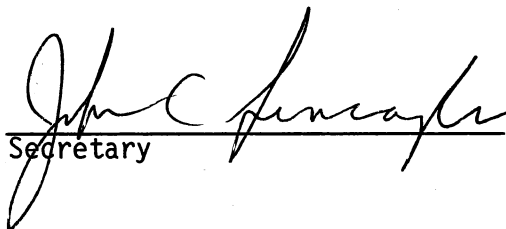
Mrs. Goodson reported on the New Jersey School Boards change in by-laws regarding voting rights of member school districts of the Association.
