The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, October 21, 1991 at 8:10 p.m., with Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel, President, presiding.

#### ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Mrs. Scheckel read the following:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Hermo leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on September 23, 1991 at 8:08 p.m. being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Battaglia moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Rusignuolo and unanimously approved by the Board.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Fadule presented and read the following report:

"As of this meeting every open house in the district has been conducted. The Administration and many Board members carried the message of priorities, accomplishments and high standards to the public. Appreciation was expressed to the P.T.A.'s and staff whose diligence made the evenings successful.

"Comments pertaining to enrollment in the Nutley Public Schools - September 30, 1991 (attached)."

Dr. Fadule mentioned that over all, the enrollment in the district this year increased by 33 students. Last year's enrollment was 3,312, and this year is 3,345. He added that the decline in enrollment has been leveling off the past few years.

"Comments pertaining to the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools' evaluation of Nutley High School which begins on Wednesday, October 30, 1991."

Mr. Jacone, principal of Nutley High School, explained the process which takes place during the Middle States Evaluation and distributed copies of background information on the Middle States Association.
