The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, February 24, 1992 at 8:01 p.m., with Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel, President, presiding.

Mrs. Scheckel called a recess at 8:18 p.m.

RESUME MEETING:

The meeting resumed at 8:23 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on January 27, 1992 at 8:00 p.m. being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Battaglia moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Kucinski and unanimously approved by the Board.

Copies of the minutes of the Special Meeting held on February 3, 1992 at 7:00 p.m. being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Kucinski moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Battaglia and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Sincaglia presented and read the following communications:

1. A letter from Assemblyman John V. Kelly responding to a letter Mr. Sincaglia sent to him regarding state aid to education.
2. A resolution from the Wayne Township Board of Education opposing a proposed change in state legislation which would allow unemployment benefits to be paid for summer recess to ten-month nonprofessional employees of school districts under a portion of federal law.
3. A letter from Senate Minority Leader John Lynch responding to Mr. Sincaglia's letter opposing a change in the date of the school election and stating his agreement with Mr. Sincaglia.
4. A letter from Thomas B. Corcoran, Policy Advisor for Education to Governor Florio, responding to the letter sent to the Governor regarding state aid and pointing out changes in the school funding mechanism because of the Governor's proposed pension revaluation.
5. A letter from Assembly Minority Leader Joseph V. Doria, Jr. expressing concern over alterations that might be made to the education aid figures released by the Department of Education.
6. A letter from Martin Cohn regarding aspects of the basketball program at Nutley High School.
7. A notice from the Passaic and Essex County School Boards Associations regarding a Legislative Dinner to be held on March 11, 1992.
8. A letter from Assembly Minority Leader Joseph V. Doria, Jr. concerning Mr. Sincaglia's letter regarding delaying the school election and indicating he was opposed to changing the date.
9. A letter from Assemblywoman Stephanie R. Bush indicating that she agreed that the election date should not be changed.
10. A notice from the Essex County Educational Services Commission that the February 27, 1992 meeting had been cancelled and stating that the next meeting would be held on March 26.

Mrs. Hresko noted that the Radcliffe School PTA Executive Board decided to send letters to legislators opposing any change in the date of the school election and to date had received replies from Senate Minority Leader John Lynch and Assemblywoman Stephanie R. Bush agreeing with the opposition to any change in election date.

Dr. Votto indicated that Gertrude Fleischer had sent a thank-you letter for the remembrance of her late husband, Dr. Robert D. Fleischer.

Mr. Sincaglia mentioned that the state legislature today passed legislation to change the date of the school election to April 28, adding that there is some question whether the Governor will sign it. Mr. Sincaglia added that the Governor has 45 days to act on the bill.

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys as of January 31, 1992. (See attached report.)

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Votto presented and read the following report:

"Attached is the student enrollment chart as of January 31, 1992.

"Second quarter report cards were distributed on February 7, 1992.

"The implementation of district priorities is progressing quite well at this time."

Dr. Votto noted that of particular interest this past month were two staff development programs held on Saturday, February 8, one being a committee of teachers and administrators participating in a critical skills workshop and another dealing with testing and new students. Dr. Votto added that the workshops were interesting and informative and helpful in bridging gaps between instructional theory and classroom practice. He concluded by stating that the youngsters would surely benefit.

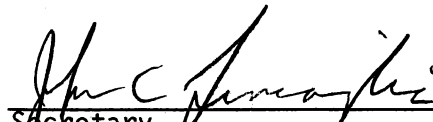
