The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, April 27, 1992 at 8:00 p.m., with Mr. Sam P. Battaglia, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Mr. Battaglia read the following:

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Kucinski leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mr. John G. Griwert, Mr. Frank V. Hermo, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr. and Mr. Charles J. Piro. Absent: Mrs. Sally Goodson, Mrs. Aileen Hresko, Mr. Robert J. Rusignuolo and Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel. Approximately 22 citizens were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on March 23, 1992 at 8:00 p.m. being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Piro moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Kucinski and unanimously approved by the Board.

Copies of the minutes of the Organization Meeting held on April 13, 1992 at 7:30 p.m. being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mr. Piro moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Kucinski and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Sincaglia presented and read the following communications:

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Dr. Fadule mentioned that the HSPT results are in, they are good and are basically the same as last year. He added that he would report to the Board in more depth after there has been an opportunity to evaluate the reports.

Dr. Fadule stated that he had received notification today that the high school was officially accredited by the Middle States Association, and at some time in the future he would have high school people talk with the Board about this.

Dr. Fadule recommended that the end of the year school calendar be changed as follows: the last day of school to be Wednesday, June 24 instead of Thursday, June 25; Monday and Tuesday, June 22 and 23 be one-session days with the afternoons to be used as clerical days by the staff. Dr. Fadule explained that these changes could be made because the district has met its curriculum objectives and only used one snow day. Dr. Fadule also recommended keeping the high school graduation date as June 24 but moving the Franklin School and elementary school promotions from Wednesday, June 24 to Tuesday, June 23.

Mr. Kucinski moved that the Board accept the recommendations of the Superintendent regarding the end of the year school calendar, seconded by Mr. Piro and unanimously approved by the Board.

"A presentation by Jerilyn Margulies on behalf of the Grade 3 Social Studies Committee - 'Our Town, Nutley, New Jersey.'"

Miss Margulies explained the genesis of the curriculum committee for the study of Nutley. She then gave an over-view of what would be included in this nine-week course while referring to course materials which had been distributed to the Board members. Miss Margulies explained that copies of the course materials would be placed in each school library in the district, and two copies would be in the Nutley Public Library.

Miss Margulies introduced each member of the committee and thanked them for their hard work. Mr. Griwert and Dr. Votto both complimented Miss Margulies and the members of the committee on the excellent job they had done. Dr. Fadule indicated that he was proud of the job the members of the committee had done and added that it was the curriculum system at its best.




