The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Radcliffe School Gymnasium, 379 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, February 22, 1993 at 8:01 p.m., with Mr. Sam P. Battaglia, President, presiding.

Mr. Battaglia read the following:

The meeting resumed at 8:30 p.m.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia further commented that the public will be voting on Current Expense and Capital Outlay, but he stressed that this does not mean any additional projects. The new Capital Outlay question is a vote on monies for equipment purchases which used to be incorporated in the Current Expense portion of the budget, and these items are integral to the operation of the schools.


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Mr. Griwert noted that it should be stressed that the March 1 special meeting is for preliminary approval of the 1993-94 budget.


