Dr. Fadule noted that the results were excellent. He explained that this was the first time the newly revised HSPT Grade 11 test actually counted. It must be passed in order to graduate. He added that those who did not pass were being helped and would be given the opportunity to try again in a few months. Dr. Fadule indicated that he had checked with a few other districts and comparatively speaking, Nutley did quite well.

"Comments pertaining to snow days and the school calendar."

Dr. Fadule explained that, as is well known, this winter has been very intense and two extra days are needed to complete the school calendar. Dr. Fadule noted that after much deliberation, it was his recommendation that the two days be made up at the end of the year. He added that if more than two additional snow days are needed, he would have to consider what else can be done.

### CAFETERIA REPORT:

Mr. Kucinski thanked the members of the Budget Committee for their hard work.

Mrs. Goodson mentioned that Lincoln School will hold its PTA talent show on Friday at Franklin School.

Mrs. Goodson gave an update to the Board regarding the child care program. Mrs. Scheckel questioned if all schools were charging the same amount for the child care program, to which Mrs. Goodson replied in the affirmative.

Mr. Rusignuolo indicated that he and Mrs. Scheckel attended the recent Essex County School Boards Association meeting on February 16. He noted that Dennis Testa, President of the New Jersey Education Association, and Carolyn Smith, President of the New Jersey School Boards Association, talked about a variety of things important in education today, and he felt that both organizations have the interests of the students at heart.
