Board of Education Nutley, New Jersey October 24, 1994

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, October 24, 1994 at 8:04 p.m., with Mr. Sam P. Battaglia, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Mr. Battaglia read the following:

"According to the provisions of the 'Open Public Meetings Act' (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975), proper notice of this Regular Meeting was provided in the Annual Notice of May 2, 1994. Said Notice was:

"Formal action will be taken."

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mrs. Hresko leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mr. Frank V. Hermo, Mrs. Aileen Hresko, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., Mr. Joseph C. Pelaia, Mr. Charles J. Piro, Mr. Robert J. Rusignuolo, Mrs. Maria Russo and Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel. Approximately 25 citizens were present.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS:

Dr. Fadule noted that, once again, the Board of Education has the opportunity to recognize and congratulate some fine young people who have distinguished themselves, their families and school in the area of music.

Dr. Fadule introduced Mr. John Vitkovsky, Coordinator of Music Education, who explained the process in selecting students to the All State Chorus. One thousand students from participating high schools tried out for the All State Chorus, and approximately 200 were chosen.

Mr. Vitkovsky thanked the parents of the students for their presence this evening and for their continuing support of the Nutley music program. He also thanked the Board of Education, Dr. Fadule, Dr. Votto and Mr. Jacone for their support.

Mr. Battaglia called a recess at 8:12 p.m.

RESUME MEETING:

The meeting resumed at 8:15 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on September 26, 1994 at 8:01 p.m. being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mrs. Hresko moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mrs. Russo and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Sincaglia presented and read the following communications:

- 1. A notice from the Essex County School Boards Association regarding a Negotiations Data Exchange to be held on November 5, 1994.
- 2. A notice from the Essex County School Boards Association regarding the Fall Dinner Meeting to take place on November 9, 1994 at which time there will be an update from the Ethics Commission.

- 3. A communication from The National Humane Education Society concerning alternative teaching methods.
- 4. Two resolutions from the Wayne Township Public Schools which they adopted last month dealing with permissive legislation for providing bussing where parents would pay and to be able to offer life or health insurance through self insurance.

Mr. Sincaglia noted that municipalities are allowed to do this but not boards of education.

5. A thank-you note from John Griwert for the football tickets.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Secretary as of September 30, 1994. (See attached report.)

Mrs. Scheckel moved that the Board accept the Report of the Secretary, seconded by Mr. Kucinski. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys as of September 30, 1994. (See attached report.)

Mrs. Scheckel moved that the Board accept the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys, seconded by Mr. Kucinski. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Fadule presented and read the following report:

"As of this meeting every Open House in the district has been conducted. The Administration and many Board members carried the message of priorities, accomplishments and high standards to the public. Appreciation was expressed to the PTA's and staff whose diligence made the evenings successful."

Dr. Fadule indicated that the Open Houses were a very positive experience and an evening well spent. He added that the parents and staff with whom he spoke seemed to be quite pleased.

"Quality Assurance Annual Report"

Dr. Fadule noted that this is something that is done every year.

Mr. Kucinski moved that the Board of Education accept the Quality Assurance Annual Report, seconded by Mrs. Scheckel. On a roll call vote, the resolution was unanimously approved by the Board.

"On Wednesday, November 23, schools will be in session for a half-day before Thanksgiving Recess. Classes will resume on Monday, November 28.

CAFETERIA REPORT:

Mrs. Hresko presented the cafeteria report as of September 30, 1994 showing a 1994/1995 budget of \$586,900.00, contractual orders to date of \$329,910.83, leaving funds available of \$256,989.17.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mr. Hermo reported that the Facilities Committee had further discussions concerning the replacement of doors at the crew boathouse in Kearny, adding that the basic reason for replacement was for safety purposes.

Mr. Hermo indicated that the Facilities Committee recommends to the Board that we pay our share of the cost, which is approximately \$775.

Mrs. Russo moved that the Board pay its share of the cost of the doors, seconded by Mrs. Scheckel. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted.

Mrs. Hresko noted that the Policy Committee had met to review policies and these would be voted on by the Board at the November and December meetings. She urged Board members to review the material.

HEARING OF CITIZENS (Resolutions Only):

Mrs. Joan Rubino, 48 North Road, asked what "Parenting" is as mentioned in resolution #11. Dr. Votto explained the evolution of this program from its genesis at Lincoln School and which is designed to foster home-school interaction. Dr. Votto added that this was adopted as a priority and one meeting had been held thus far with the second meeting to take place on November 5.

Mrs. Rubino then questioned why Dr. Vivinetto had been paid for his attendance at the meeting. Mr. Battaglia explained that Dr. Vivinetto was paid pursuant to the administrator's agreement under a "grandfather" clause.

Dr. Fadule indicated that this was a difficult loss.
Mrs. Boettger had been a very fine teacher and person and had
just retired a few years ago. He noted that Mrs. Boettger was
a wonderful human being, adding that she was a nurse in addition
to being a Special Education teacher. She always offered her services wherever needed. Dr. Fadule stated that she would be missed.

Dr. Fadule noted that everything he heard about Miss Finnan indicated that she was a very fine teacher and person who will be missed. Mr. Battaglia mentioned that he remembered Miss Finnan from when he was in high school and she was a very nice lady.

HEARING OF CITIZENS:

Mr. Richard Meola, 7 Harvard Street, asked if the Board had made any decision about participating in the state-wide computer system under the aegis of Stevens Institute of Technology. He also asked if the Board had discussed having delayed openings on snow days. Dr. Fadule replied that nothing has been done regarding the computer network since more information is needed. Regarding the delayed opening on snow days, Dr. Fadule noted that this had been discussed many times, Board policy would allow it, but it is felt that the present system is adequate. He added that early dismissal on snow days had also been discussed, but there are serious questions regarding this, and it was felt that the present system was a good one.

Mr. Meola then asked how late was a decision made on the closing of school. Dr. Fadule responded that he tries to make the decision by 6:00 a.m. so that everyone involved could be notified as soon as possible. He added that he did not know what time the parents were notified.

Mrs. Gail Kline, 28 North Spring Garden Avenue, expressed her concerns with the pressures experienced by first and second graders regarding tests and grades. Dr. Fadule noted that the questions regarding the grading system emerge every few years and this had been studied in depth several times. He explained that years ago grades were not given in the lower grades, but then the teachers complained that when the students finally received letter grades, there was disappointment in many cases. Dr. Fadule added that we will continue to look at this but the priorities have already been established for this year.

Mr. Piro indicated that the types of pressures put on the children are not put on by the district itself; the pressures are put on by the parents and peers. He added that perhaps we should address how parents should handle the pressures on the children.

Mrs. Scheckel mentioned that this may very well be something that could be added to the topics considered by the Parenting Committee.

Mr. Hermo noted that he agreed with Mrs. Scheckel, adding that young children have to be taught on their abilities to learn. Mr. Hermo indicated that the important thing is do the children know how to read by the time they reach third grade and feel good about themselves.

Dr. Fadule indicated that our teachers do make an effort to see that the children have self confidence.

Mr. Kucinski questioned if Mrs. Kline could attend the Parenting Committee meeting, to which Dr. Votto replied in the affirmative, adding that he would be in touch with her.

Mrs. Eva Pfuhler, 345 High Street, expressed her concern about the fact that notes were sent home regarding testing at the high school, but nothing was mentioned about when the students would be dismissed from school.

Mrs. Pfuhler requested an update on the problem with drugs in the high school and questioned why the police department needs permission to enter the school. Dr. Fadule indicated that extensive talks and meetings were held with the police and things are happening in that regard. Dr. Fadule added that the police need permission to speak with a student.

Dr. Votto explained that there is an agreement of understanding signed and filed between every police department and school in the state. He noted that if a crime is being committed, the police have every right to come in and they will, but surveillance is a local option. He added that the Essex County Prosecutors Office would be intimately involved.

Mrs. Pfuhler asked if the situation was improving. Mr. Battaglia indicated that the Board is cognizant of what is going on but that it would be counterproductive to announce what is planned.

Mrs. Kathy Rempusheski, 525 Kingsland Street, stated that she felt the Board is missing the point about self esteem and discussed the pressures on the children in the early grades and the grading system. Dr. Fadule indicated that if Mrs. Rempusheski wanted to come in and talk about these things, she was welcome to do so.

Mrs. Rempusheski questioned the possibility of taking a survey of the parents. Mr. Battaglia suggested that Mrs. Rempusheski call Dr. Votto to schedule an appointment.

Mrs. Scheckel noted that last year the Academic Booster Club had a meeting on that very issue at which Dr. Votto and Dr. McCarthy spoke.

Mrs. Rubino questioned if teachers receive extra compensation for attending PTA meetings or evening conferences, to which Dr. Fadule replied in the negative.

Mrs. Rubino questioned if longevity is included when determining Mrs. Serafino's ten percent of salary payment for the computer program to which Mr. Sincaglia replied in the negative.

Dr. Votto noted that he has been involved in teacher negotiations for many years, and he wanted it known that the teachers came forward with the idea of their attending evening conferences at no extra pay. Dr. Fadule added that there are countless times when the teachers and staff give of themselves on a voluntary basis.
