The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Board Room, 375 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, June 19, 1995 at 8:02 p.m., with Mr. Sam P. Battaglia, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Mr. Battaglia read the following:

"According to the provisions of the 'Open Public Meetings Act' (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975), proper notice of this Regular Meeting was provided in the Notice of June 13, 1995. Said Notice was:

1. Posted at the entrance to the Board Office.
2. Mailed to The Nutley Sun, the Star Ledger, the North Jersey Herald & News and the Nutley Journal.
3. Mailed to the Nutley Township Clerk.

"Formal action will be taken."

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mr. Kucinski leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

CALL OF ROLL:

The other members present at roll call were: Mrs. Michele Fleitell, Mr. Charles W. Kucinski, Jr., Mr. Franklin J. Patterson, Mr. Joseph C. Pelaia, Mr. Robert J. Rusignuolo, Mrs. Maria Russo, Mrs. Rosalie C. Scheckel and Mr. Robert Schweikert, Jr. Approximately 25 citizens were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Copies of the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on May 22, 1995 at 8:01 p.m. being in the hands of each member, reading of same was dispensed. Mrs. Scheckel moved that the minutes be approved, seconded by Mr. Kucinski and unanimously approved by the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Sincaglia presented and read the following communications:

1. A thank-you note from Debra Ippolito, cafeteria employee, for the Board's expression of sympathy upon the loss of her mother.
2. A letter from the Winfield Township School expressing appreciation for Nutley's offer of assistance.

Mr. Sincaglia explained that they had suffered a fire and we had offered them some of our surplus furniture, which, it turned out, they did not need.

3. A letter from Project Graduation 1995 concerning an item of transportation cost.

Mr. Sincaglia indicated that Mr. Pelaia would address this item under New Business.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Secretary as of May 31, 1995. (See attached report.)

Mr. Sincaglia noted that the close of the fiscal year is at hand and two more payrolls had to be run, petty cash accounts had to be closed out and routine bills had to be paid. He requested Board authorization for he and Dr. Fadule to take care of these routine matters, adding that there would be a bill list in July related to these items and on which the Board would vote.

Mrs. Scheckel moved that the Board accept the Report of the Secretary with recommendations, seconded by Mr. Kucinski. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS:

Dr. Fadule noted that this has been an outstanding year for achievements of our students. He indicated that the girls' softball team and the rifle team had won state championships and tonight we are honoring students who came in first in the state of New Jersey in a stock investment club contest. Dr. Fadule added that the students distinguished themselves, their families and school. He then introduced Mr. John Jacone, principal of Nutley High School.

Mr. Jacone thanked the Board for having the awards presentation. He explained that 746 teams from New Jersey entered the competition, and he congratulated the Nutley team for its success.

Mr. Sincaglia presented the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys as of May 31, 1995. (See attached report.)

Mrs. Scheckel moved that the Board accept the Report of the Treasurer of School Moneys, seconded by Mr. Kucinski. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted.

CAFETERIA REPORT:

Mr. Kucinski presented the cafeteria report as of May 31, 1995 showing a 1994/1995 budget of \$586,900.00, contractual orders to date of \$537,032.58, leaving funds available of \$49,867.42.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mr. Pelaia indicated that the Athletic Committee had met earlier this evening and discussed adding a freshman girls' soccer team. He noted that the consensus was that it is time to fill this gap, and the Athletic Committee was asking Board approval to add the team for the 1995-96 school year.

Mr. Kucinski moved that the Board approve the addition of a freshman girls' soccer team for the 1995/1996 school year, seconded by Mrs. Scheckel and unanimously approved by the Board.

Mr. Pelaia further indicated that the issue of lacrosse was discussed and the Athletic Committee is requesting that a feasibility study be conducted through Mr. Jacone and Mr. Zarra, and this is to encompass boys' lacrosse and girls' lacrosse/field hockey. He added that any action would be for the 1996/1997 school year, taking into consideration budgetary matters and scheduling.

Mr. Kucinski, Chairman of the Budget Review Committee, stated that he was pleased to report that the school district has exceeded revenue projections for tuition receipts by approximately \$96,000 and transportation contracts have brought in an additional \$63,000. With regard to tuition income, Mr. Kucinski explained that we were able to accommodate more special education students from other districts, and with regard to transportation contracts, we took advantage of opportunities to join with other districts.

Mr. Kucinski complimented the Board for setting this direction for the administration, indicating that Dr. Fadule, Dr. Votto and Mr. Sincaglia had done an outstanding job in finding ways to generate some income. He noted that this positive information allows us to accelerate improvement of technology, and he added that the Budget Review Committee recommends that the Board approve the purchase of 30 additional MacIntosh computers and printers for the elementary schools as well as the trade in of an eight-year-old IBM computer for a more advanced model which will lower operating costs and enhance productivity. Mr. Kucinski indicated that the total cost for both of these projects would be approximately \$93,000 and the Committee felt it would be a productive use of the additional money.

Mr. Kucinski moved that the Board approve the purchase of the above-mentioned computer equipment, seconded by Mrs. Scheckel and unanimously approved by the Board.

Mrs. Russo reminded all Board members to submit any additional priority items they may have.

(Major accounts are General Fund and Debt Service.)

NEW BUSINESS:






