The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Radcliffe School Gymnasium, 379 Bloomfield Avenue, on Tuesday, May 26, 1998 at 8:18 p.m. with Mr. Vincent Moscaritola, Vice-President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Mr. Moscaritola read the following:

FLAG SALUTE:

The meeting was opened with Mrs. Fleitell leading the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS:

Dr. Votto remarked that this evening is once again a time for prideful recognition, adding that the scholars, athletes and coaches here this evening have all won critical acclaim at the local, regional and state levels for their academic or athletic prowess this past winter. He noted that these people have certainly done their peers, school district and families proud and we salute them tonight and congratulate them on a job well done. He indicated that they are champions all. Dr. Votto thanked the parents for giving the district such good clay with which to work. Dr. Votto further noted that the students have acquitted themselves extremely well academically and athletically. He also indicated that Mr. Mario Cocchiola, high school principal, Dr. James Vivinetto, Franklin School principal, and Miss Barbara Hirsch, Director of Special Services who has been involved since the inception of the Johns Hopkins program, would be assisting in the presentation of the awards.

Miss Hirsch explained that the Johns Hopkins Talent Search for students was developed in 1985 and its purpose was to identify fifth and sixth graders who reached the ceiling of the on-grade achievement test. She noted that the off-grade test is written at the ninth grade level. The tests allow appropriate planning for these students as they go to the middle and high school. Miss Hirsch noted that these students are able to participate in many academic activities throughout the country as they go through their academic careers.

Miss Hirsch also stated that over 60 students took the plus test and over 25 received distinction in verbal, math or a combination of both areas. She noted that these students will be recognized at the regional level by Johns Hopkins on June 1 at NJIT. Miss Hirsch congratulated the parents for a job well done.

Dr. Vivinetto expressed his pleasure at the opportunity to once again recognize Franklin School students who have participated in this wonderful program, adding that Franklin School has participated since the program's inception. He explained that the scores on the math and verbal reasoning abilities among students in grade 7 are the result of the students taking the SAT which is a test for college-bound seniors.

Dr. Vivinetto noted that 46 students were eligible and 26 students took the SAT this year, adding that the average score was a 500 as a mean and our students received a score of 455 with a range of 360-600 in the verbal portion and in the math portion, the mean was 489 with a range of 370-600.

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Dr. Vivinetto indicated that we have 10 students here who received a score of 510-559 and six of these students received an award from the state because of their scores of 560-600.

WHEREAS, Mr. Gallagher won the admiration and respect of his fellow teachers and the friendship of pupils who came under the influence of his understanding and capable teaching,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley extends deepest sympathy to the members of his family, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be made a part of the minutes of this meeting and a copy sent to the members of his family.

Dr. Votto noted that everyone was deeply shocked and saddened to hear of Mr. Gallagher's passing last week and he commended the staff and faculty for coming together during this period of mourning. He indicated that our hearts go out to his family and friends, adding that he will be sorely missed.

HEARING OF CITIZENS:

<u>Mrs. Joan Rubino</u>, 48 North Road, remarked that she saw that Mr. SanFillipo has resigned as head football coach and asked if he will assume a full schedule of classes, to which Dr. Votto replied in the affirmative. Mrs. Rubino asked if he would also give up the position of Coordinator of Intra-Mural Sports and Leisure Activities to which Dr. Votto responded that it is under consideration at this time although it appears it may be restructured. He added that he has not made any recommendation to the Board at this time.

Mrs. Rubino urged the Board to consider very carefully before giving any perks to the new head football coach. She noted that if the Coordinator position is contracted yearly, she feels it would be advisable to review what is actually done and the time spent since it is like a no-show job.

<u>Mr. Tom Evans</u>, 18 Edgewood Avenue, asked if the keyboarding course is mandatory for graduating, relating the difficulties experienced by his daughter in trying to make time to take the course while being involved in many activities, taking honors courses and being involved in the music program. Dr. Votto responded that it is a mandatory course at this time. Mr. Evans expressed his feeling that with so much information available in other venues it should not be necessary to take a keyboarding course and he does not feel it should be a mandatory requirement. He requested that this matter come under policy review since he feels it should be an elective course.

Dr. Casale questioned if the keyboarding course could be offered in summer school or as a Saturday program, to which Dr. Votto responded that it is possible but would have to be thought out.

Mr. Moscaritola asked if there were some sort of alternative testing. Dr. Votto replied in the affirmative, adding that if a student takes the test and successfully passes, taking of the keyboarding course can be waived.

Mrs. Russo noted that at the March Board meeting she had given her opinion of the total technology curriculum, adding that it has been her contention to seriously look into whether this program should be maintained in the high school or possibly be moved down to the middle school and then enhance the computer program at the high school. Mrs. Russo further indicated that she would hope this Board would look at some of the requests made by the public.

Mrs. Fleitell remarked that she certainly does not want to minimize what is taught in the course, but by ninth grade students should have learned all of that. She noted that she has recommended at least moving the course down to the middle school, adding that students should be learning many of the skills by the time they come out of the elementary schools. Mrs. Fleitell also noted that moving keyboarding to the middle school would enhance their curriculum. She further indicated that she feels that if there continues to be a problem, she feels that Dr. Casale's suggestion of a summer program or weekend course would be appropriate.

Dr. Votto noted that the key would be if the student was able to meet the provisions required for the course. He added that it is under review and the administration feels confident that every student going through the course is quite proficient. He also indicated that a study was commissioned which is going on at the present time, explaining that a questionnaire was sent to last year's graduating seniors who are now in college asking their response regarding areas of concern with that course and how it impacted college life.

<u>Mrs. Gail Kline</u>, 28 North Spring Garden Avenue, asked if there was any preliminary information regarding the transcript issue. Dr. Votto replied that there will be no preliminary report; a final report will be forthcoming by mid-June. He noted that data is being collected and some interesting things are coming to light.

Mrs. Kline asked if anything different was being done in the approach to discussing this matter with the teachers than was done by Dr. Votto's predecessor. Dr. Votto replied that the committee is broad based with more than 20 members looking at the issue from all angles, adding that it is a teacher-based committee with a few administrative members. Mrs. Kline noted that she has been trying to receive grade distributions since 1996 and asked if there was any hope that she would receive this information before Dr. Votto retires, to which Dr. Votto replied "probably not." Mrs. Kline remarked that it is her understanding that this is a part of a report supplied to the state. Dr. Votto replied that grade distributions are not required by the state; this is an internal data base and, upon advice of counsel, this information need not be supplied to the public.

<u>Mr. Randy Rauco</u>, 184 Mountainview Avenue, questioned if the Board had looked into the incident regarding the bus trip to Toronto, stating that he had received forms from the bus company and wanted to know whether he should fill them out. Mr. Sincaglia replied that the forms should be filled out since the hospital needs to be paid and the district's position was that the parents should not be out of pocket in any way. Mr. Sincaglia further noted that the day we called the bus company they had already mailed the forms asking parents to indicate what their costs were. He reiterated that the claim form should be filled out promptly, adding that it seems the bus company would like to settle the matter.

Mr. Sincaglia further noted that we are talking about a company that transports thousands of people to New York on a daily basis. Mr. Rauco asked what would happen with regard to the lost wages some of the chaperones had sustained. Dr. Votto remarked that the teachers were excused with a professional day. Mr. Sincaglia said that people should submit any loss stating "nothing ventured, nothing gained," adding that he was not certain what DeCamp's response would be but they did say that if anyone wanted to file a law suit their legal department would handle it differently.

Dr. Casale asked if all the chaperones on the trip had been interviewed, to which Dr. Votto replied in the negative, noting that was a concern with a number of people. Dr. Votto also noted that there were two or three different problems relative to the trip; one was dealing with supervising of the youngsters in the park and another was how long did the bus travel before it pulled over.

Dr. Casale questioned if any reply had been received from the Board attorney regarding this matter. Dr. Votto indicated that the Board attorney knows we expect DeCamp to pay the hospital costs but we will have to consult with the attorney regarding the issue of lost wages.

Mrs. Kline remarked that she is in a state of shock that Dr. Votto said she would probably not receive the information she is seeking. Dr. Votto replied that under the advice of counsel we take this particular stance. Mrs. Kline asked if it was usual to just "blow off" a parent with a question. Dr. Votto indicated that he has repeatedly told Mrs. Kline that she should not be privy to that information as it is not within her purview.

Mrs. Rubino asked why the information Mrs. Kline is seeking is such a secret and what is the law saying she can't have it. Dr. Votto responded that it is not a public document per our counsel and there is also a question about dealing with employees' records and right to privacy, to which Mrs. Rubino does not see where it would affect teachers since all Mrs. Kline is asking for is an overall view. <u>Mr. Bob Suchocki</u>, 5 Maple Place, asked if the Board has determined to never use DeCamp again. He stated that he feels there was negligence on the part of DeCamp. Dr. Votto noted that the Board is waiting for a recommendation from the administration and this would have to be taken under review.

Mr. Sincaglia commented that he did not want to minimize what happened but on the other hand we have had a better than 25-year history with DeCamp and he did not feel that inappropriate action on the part of one driver should automatically be cause for never using them again. Mr. Sincaglia further noted that he did not think it was DeCamp's policy to put passengers in harms way. He also said that DeCamp does not have the violations such as have been cited against other companies in the area. Mr. Sincaglia also stated that if the Board feels we should not use DeCamp, that is their choice.

Mr. Suchocki remarked that with a 25-year history with DeCamp they should have supplied us with better-equipped buses than they did. Mr. Sincaglia then asked Susan Davis, Transportation Coordinator, when the request was made to DeCamp for the buses. Ms. Davis replied that the request was made within the last month and a half. Mr. Sincaglia clarified that the buses were not rented by the Board but we obtained the buses in response to a request to facilitate this, adding that the Band Boosters were free to go with any company they wanted.

Dr. Casale indicated that we have a failure to communicate and this matter is far from closed. He noted that he feels we need to collect a lot more information on this incident and can not make a complete, informed decision until we do.

<u>Mrs. Arlene Lobay</u>, 2 Fernwood Terrace, asked where the incident report would come from. Mr. Moscaritola replied that it would come from those involved and from the bus company staff. Mrs. Lobay asked why the people on the bus were not questioned as to what happened.

Mr. Moscaritola asked if Mrs. Lobay felt that the bus was not stopped in short enough order, to which Mrs. Lobay replied in the affirmative, adding that she felt the teacher should have made the bus driver stop since Mrs. Lobay herself had gone to the driver three times and was ignored. Mrs. Lobay then explained her experiences during the trip, noting that the fumes were visible.

Mr. Suchocki noted that at the last stop the driver kicked the exhaust pipe back in place and wanted the children to get back on the bus but at that point everyone refused to do so.

Mr. Rauco indicated that when the pipe came off the bus, the bus drivers didn't know what they were looking for and could not find anything wrong and by the time the bus got to the rest stop the students were feeling ill. He further noted that with regard to the HazMat team finding nothing wrong, the reading on the bus was taken after the pipe was back on. Mr. Sincaglia stated that the district was told a reading was taken with the motor running and with the motor not running and we still do not have a report from the people in New York. He noted that we received a report from the Thruway police which just states that the children got sick. He added that he would like to see the HazMat report but Mr. Rauco's point about when the test was done is well taken. Mr. Moscaritola commented that he has been in touch with the group in New York and has been assured we will receive the HazMat report.

Mr. Suchocki noted that the students had to go back on the bus to get their belongings and were terrified to do so.

<u>Mrs. Phyllis Kropp</u>, 48 Hillside Avenue, indicated that when the students got onto the new bus, no one would sit in the back because they had such fear. She noted that if we had a 25-year history with the bus company, they should have provided us with a better bus.

<u>Mrs. Mary Dudasik</u>, 29 Daily Street, asked what is being done with regard to polling of the teachers and administrators concerning the transcript issue. Dr. Votto noted that it is a one-item committee with regard to the prospect of placing numerics on the transcript. Mrs. Dudasik asked if a report of their findings would be given to the public. Dr. Votto replied that the committee will report to himself and it is up to him to make a recommendation to the Board. He noted that the report will most likely be held at a conference session, probably around mid-June.

Mrs. Russo remarked that at the April meeting she had asked to be a part of this committee as did other Board members. She added that she did not know the Committee had convened. Dr. Votto replied that he had cleared the way for Mrs. Fleitell to sit on the committee. Mrs. Fleitell indicated that she was not able to attend the first couple of meetings. Mrs. Russo noted that Mrs. Fleitell could have conferred with other members of the Board.

Mr. Moscaritola asked if Mrs. Fleitell, as Chair, could contact other members of the Committee with regard to dates. Mrs. Russo stated that she thought all members of the Board would be notified when the Committee was scheduled to meet.

Mrs. Russo remarked that with regard to the band trip, she was called Sunday night and was assured the students had received medical care and were on their way home. She noted that she does not have a copy of any report from parents, teachers or anyone. She added that if there is something we, as a Board, have to decide she would like all of these reports as they come in so she can intelligently discuss the situation and come up with conclusions. Dr. Votto noted that the President and Vice President of the Board and the President of the Band Boosters have received reports; the full Board does not have all the reports.

Mrs. Russo, with regard to grade distributions, said that if it is not illegal to give this information to members of the public, then she does not understand why a person should be asking for three years and still not have it. She said that perhaps this could be discussed at a Conference Meeting when the public could hear, adding that she does not know why this information is being held secret. Dr. Votto responded that when the attorney says it is not a public document, we decide not to deal with it as such. <u>Mrs. Brenda Sherman</u>, 10 Vine Street, suggested that a questionnaire be sent to the chaperones who were on the bus the day of the incident, have them return their replies and then have someone report to the parents as to what the Board believes occurred.

Mrs. Lobay asked if the parents would ever know the outcome of the bus incident. Dr. Votto indicated that the Board will receive the reports but the claim regarding lost wages is something he had just heard this evening. He noted that this would have to be a factor in our dealings with DeCamp and the insurance company.

Mr. Moscaritola commented that Mrs. Lobay requested to be privy to the reports but as a Board, we may not be allowed to disseminate it to the public. He noted that this has to be checked legally.

Mrs. Lobay questioned whether any rules would be formulated for chaperones. Dr. Votto noted that the chaperones volunteer their services and their efforts and help are appreciated. Mrs. Lobay asked if there were guidelines for the staff. Dr. Votto replied that there certainly were.

Mr. Moscaritola stated that the entire incident is being investigated and anyone who would like to submit a report is welcome to do so.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Rusignuolo questioned if the issue of the appointment of the Board attorney was to be resolved this evening. Mr. Moscaritola replied that the issue will be resolved at the June meeting, adding that he had received a full report of expenditures made to the attorney for the year. Mrs. Fleitell commented that she would like to receive a copy of that information.
