The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Radcliffe School Multi-Purpose Room, 379 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, June 26, 2000 at 8:18 p.m. with Dr. Philip T. Casale, Vice-President, presiding.

#### **ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:**

Dr. Casale read the following:

3. A notice from the New Jersey School Boards Association indicating opposition to oral recitation legislation, Senate Bill 869, which seeks to mandate that every student recite the first 55 words of the Declaration of Independence following the Pledge of Allegiance.

The New Jersey School Boards Association feels this legislation makes a mockery of the State Mandate/State Pay constitutional requirement and usurps "home rule" from local boards of education.

- 4. A letter from Marguerite M. Cox expressing her opinion that the Board of Education is not giving enough consideration to the arts in Nutley High School and asking for a more-balanced approach.
- 5. A letter from Danielle Meola, seventh grade student at Franklin Middle School, requesting that the school be renamed John H. Walker Middle School in honor of his memory.
- 6. A letter from Ann Rabinowitz as follows:

"I write to express my sorrow at the death of John Walker: teacher, principal, Assistant Superintendent but most of all sterling human being. In his passing, Nutley and its children have suffered an immeasurable loss. He will be difficult, no virtually impossible to replace.

"In John Walker there were no petty crookedness, no self-serving political games. He quite simply loved and cared about children and the schools that serve them; these were his life. I cannot think of anyone who better deserved the title 'educator.'

"I shall never forget his friendship and his loyal support through my own service on the Board (1975-1984). Like many others in the community, I feel privileged to have known him."

#### **HEARING OF CITIZENS:**

Mrs. Barbara Bochese, 50 Cedar Street, read the following statement addressed to Dr. Serafino:

"I am taking this opportunity to have you address the following:

"1. As women in the new millennium, I would like to take the time to thank Dr. Greco for bringing to light the information regarding the Nutley Board of Education's longstanding and highly visible relationship with the Third Half Club. I have no desire to debate the worthiness or the extent of the relationship that exists with this organization. Very simply, the Third Half Club discriminates against you, me, and every female athlete and coach. All of us. As a school district that receives federal funds, that teaches our children 'tolerance' and does not discriminate against anyone based on religion, race or gender, you cannot allow this school district to continue this type of relationship with the Third Half Club. You must stop it immediately.

Driving home last Thursday from a meeting at 9:15 a.m. in the high school, I passed a group of children walking up Prospect Street from Centre Street to the Nutley Museum. I will assume "2. that this group of approximately 50 children was from Lincoln School. It was wonderful to see their happy faces on a beautiful morning. But as I sat to let them go by, I noticed that there was one adult in the front of the line, one in the middle and one at the end. Does this district find it satisfactory to have a ratio of one adult to every 17 children? Does there exist a policy or

procedural guidelines for class trip supervision?
This past Wednesday morning, on my way to leave for work, I dropped my sophomore at school to take his English final exam. "3. His teacher informed him that he owed her a book and would not allow him to take the exam. In fact, she told him to go home and get it before he could take the exam. My son told her his parents were both working but she would not waiver from her position. My son called his 80 year old grandfather who had to go to school to pick him up and bring him home. Dr. Serafino, what is the district's liability and responsibility towards any child who is sent home without a parent's knowledge or consent? Is there a policy or procedure in place regarding the dismissal of children from their school?

On November 1, 1999, I sent you a fax that contained a letter re-"4. garding the teacher who taped a child's hands together and put tape on his mouth. As the letter clearly states, my son was witness to this assault and spoke to me three weeks after the incident.

Upon receipt of my letter, Dr. Vivinetto immediately responded. The Division of Youth and Family Services interviewed my son, and I assume, since I have had no further contact from this district, that the subsequent removal of this teacher is in part due to the report from DYFS. At the time of my letter, and I remind you three weeks after the incident, I was only the second parent to contact the district. My paramount concern has always been that the more than 25 children went to no one, not a teacher, not a parent not a guidance counselor. In my letter I asked you to talk to these children. As with Columbine, we must reach out to our children, we must teach them to tell someone when something is wrong or makes them uncomfortable. Dr. Serafino, 8 months after my letter to you and with two more incidences of abuse in our schools, I am still waiting for there to be proactive dialogue from this administration with all of our children about abuse in any form, as well as effective, honest and ongoing communication between school and parent."

Dr. Serafino responded that Mr. Restaino was investigating the situation with the Third Half Club and, unfortunately, was not able to attend this meeting. With regard to the class trip to the Nutley Museum, Dr. Serafino indicated that she would check into this and would certainly look into the situation regarding the final exam. Dr. Serafino stated that concerning #4 the district provides programs in the middle school such as the Peer Leadership Program, has student assistance counselors available and, hopefully, with these and other programs these issues will be addressed.

Dr. Serafino continued by stating that the children in the classroom were spoken to and asked to come forward if there were any problems. She noted that no other concerns had been raised and she was certain our competent staff could handle things.

Mrs. Bochese noted that it took her son three weeks to tell her of the incident and she feels there is a great deal of miscommunication. She added that, perhaps, more dialogue is needed. Dr. Serafino replied that the Board approved the employment of another student assistance coordinator whose duties will mainly be in the middle and elementary schools.

Mrs. Becky Olivo, representing the staff at Yantacaw School with regard to the petition to rename the school the John H. Walker Elementary School, noted that Mr. Walker's roots were at Yantacaw School and asked the Board to keep in mind that this is to honor Mr. Walker, not the children.

Dr. Casale indicated that the Board would seriously consider anything it does and the determination will appear as a resolution at a public meeting. He added that there will be public discussion before a decision is made.

<u>Dr. Steven Greco.</u> 48 Vreeland Avenue, asked if a teacher was allowed to participate in school-sponsored after-school activities if the teacher had missed school for medical reasons and also asked if the district had a policy dealing with that type of situation. Dr. Serafino stated that she did not know of any policy that would preclude such a situation.

Dr. Casale remarked that the Board will have to look into this situation since there seems to be a double standard with regard to what is allowable for a teacher versus what is allowable for an athlete.

Mr. Jack Magnifico, 25 Chestnut Street, asked for clarification on the class size reduction resolution to which Dr. Serafino explained it is a non-competitive grant which enables the district to reduce class size at the pri-

mary grade level, the requirement being to hire an additional staff member. Mr. Magnifico expressed his opinion that the taxpayer will wind up paying the bill years down the road. Dr. Serafino noted that if this funding goes away the district will be back to past practice regarding class size. Mr. Sincaglia remarked that the district has the absolute right to determine the size of the staff.

- Mr. Magnifico complained about high property taxes and the hardship they put on senior citizens. Mr. Sincaglia noted that this grant is providing an extra service that can be done away with.
- Mr. Magnifico also expressed his concerns regarding security in the school buildings. Mr. Moscaritola informed him the date of the meeting regarding building security would be announced next week and he would be sure to inform Mr. Magnifico when the date is determined.
- Mr. Atef Halaka, 11 Hetherington Road, informed the Board that he had delivered a letter to them last Friday regarding a situation at Washington School. Mr. Sincaglia replied that every Board member received a copy of this letter but it was not mentioned under correspondence since it deals with a child and staff member.
- Mrs. Liz Halaka stated that her child gets treated differently and she wants everyone here to know that for three and one-half years she has been subjected to discrimination by certain people.
- Dr. Casale confirmed that every Board member had received a copy of the letter but there had not been time for the Board to discuss it. He noted that some serious issues were raised in the letter but by statute these can not be discussed in public. Dr. Casale assured the Halakas that the Board will discuss this matter and will keep the Halakas informed.

#### RESOLUTION TO CLOSE MEETING TO THE PUBLIC:

Dr. Casale requested Mr. Sincaglia to read the following resolution:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the results of the discussions will be made public by inclusion on the agenda of a subsequent meeting of the Board of Education or when the reasons for discussing such matters in closed session no longer exist.

Mr. Moscaritola moved that the resolution be approved, seconded by Mr. Pelaia and unanimously approved by the Board.
