The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Township of Nutley, New Jersey was held in the Radcliffe School Multi-Purpose Room, 379 Bloomfield Avenue, on Monday, February 25, 2002 at 8:05 p.m. with Dr. Philip T. Casale, President, presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MEETING:

Dr. Casale read the following:

FLAG SALUTE:

Mr. Moscaritola led the Board members and citizens in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS:

Dr. Serafino welcomed everyone present this evening and complimented and commended the outstanding students for their academic and athletic achievements as well as their parents. She then introduced Mr. Joseph Zarra, High School Principal.

Mr. Zarra thanked Dr. Serafino and central administration for the continued support of our students. He extended congratulations to the students and their parents for their achievements. He then introduced Ms. Judith Hubert, High School Guidance Coordinator.

Ms. Hubert explained that high-achieving students in the Garden State Scholars program are designated Edward J. Bloustein Distinguished Scholars and are in the top 10% of their class with a minimum combined SAT score of 1260 or rank first, second or third in their class at the end of the junior year. She further noted that these students attained an average of 666 in the verbal portion of the test and 686 in the math portion. Dr. Parisi presented and moved the adoption of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Moscaritola. On a roll call vote the resolution was unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Education approves the employment agreement for Maria Cervasio, Director of School-Age Extended Child Care Program, for the 2001/2002 school year.

HEARING OF CITIZENS:

Steven Clar, 12 Myrtle Avenue, said that he had heard that the architects that drew the school expansions had received 11 million dollars.

Mr. Sincaglia said the architect receives 6.9% of the construction costs. Mr. Clar made some suggestions regarding the approach for the referendum. He said he admires the way the Board has stuck together through this whole referendum process.

<u>Gail Klein</u>, 28 No. Spring Garden Avenue, asked when she was going to receive a response from the letter and document that she mailed to the Board expressing her concerns. She said in the letter she requested a written reply by February 14th and would like to know when she will be hearing from the Board concerning her letter and document.

Dr. Casale said that the issue that she brought up is a valid issue and is something that will be address but the referendum issue is at the forefront and as a result no one had the ability to respond to you by February 14th. He said it will be addressed.

Anthony Presutti, 221 Swathmore Dr., Cambridge Heights, asked what kind of an impact Cambridge Heights has on the Nutley school system.

Mr. Sincaglia said that he estimates under 50 children.

Mr. Presutti asked about the inconsistency of the mailings he received regarding the tax impact on the referendum.

Dr. Casale said that two mailings came from the Board of Education and one came from the Commissioner of Finance. He assured Mr. Presutti that the next mailing he receives regarding the referendum will have matched numbers between the Board and the Finance Department.

Dr. Casale referred to a survey that was handed out throughout the Cambridge Height Community by their Association asking several questions regarding the future impact the Community might have on the school system.

Jim Harmon, Cambridge Heights Resident, said that Howard Koval, Cambridge Heights Management Agent, passed out the survey throughout the Cambridge Heights Community. He said the survey was initiated because the people of Cambridge Heights were hearing how the referendum was necessary because of the influx from Cambridge Heights. He said that is not true because several students living in Cambridge Heights were already enrolled in the school system. He said this survey was designed to get information from the Cambridge Heights Community so they can work with the Board in getting the proper information on the future impact Cambridge Heights will have on the Nutley schools.

Dr. Casale said that he agrees that Cambridge Heights is not driving this project. He noted with or without that community our enrollment has been growing steadily and our buildings are getting older. He said that the Board is willing to come to their Community and give a presentation of what our project is now and answer any questions.

A discussion ensued between Mr. Harmon, Dr. Casale, Mr. Pelaia and Mr. Genitempo regarding the referendum.

<u>Carl Lordi</u>, 407 Manchester Dr., Cambridge Heights, he said he is a public school teacher and is sympathetic to the needs of education and children and has no problem with the referendum going through. He said talking to the people at Cambridge Heights he felt there was a misunderstanding about numbers. He said one problem from the Cambridge Heights point of view was that people were under the impression that they were being penalized and would pay a higher tax rate because they influenced the school system. He noted that is something that has to be addressed. He strongly recommended that the Board enhance the communication with the Cambridge Heights Community and the town for the benefit of the referendum.

Mr. Pelaia said he was very unhappy to hear that the people of Cambridge Heights felt there was a matter of blame placed on them. He stated hopefully it is a very limited amount of people thinking this way. He noted we are all Nutleyites and this is a matter of children in our community and what is best for them.

Tom Redner, Cambridge Heights Resident, asked if they knew the projected tax revenue coming out of Cambridge Heights when it is completed. He said he came up with 4.6 million dollars a year and asked how much of that money goes to the Board of Education and where is the rest of that money headed.

Dr. Casale said 48% of your tax bill goes to the Board of Education regardless of where you live in town. He said the Board has no information regarding the rest of the tax bill.

Mr. Redner asked several questions about the taxes and the referendum to which Mr. Sincaglia and Dr. Casale responded.

<u>Nicholas LaMagna.</u> 300 Cambridge Drive, stated he was a resident of Nutley for 42 years and said he was one of the empty nesters that moved to Cambridge Heights. He said he voted for the referendum and would have no problem paying the taxes. He felt the questionnaire should have gone out before the vote and many people do not know the true facts. He said that this school district for the last 30 or 40 years has not spent any money on expanding. He noted that his job brings him to other school districts and he is ashamed to say that other schools he visits have a lot more than this district. He said he would like to see more conversation between the Town of Nutley and the Board before anything is brought to a vote again.

Dr. Casale said that is the goal of the Board.

<u>Barbara Bochese</u>, 50 Cedar Street, said she attended the senior fashion show in January and was very upset with the sexual content of some of the acts performed that night. She urged the district to be pro-active in what is allowed to be performed.

Dr. Casale said this fashion show was run by the parents and the Board had no control over what was performed. He noted that in the future if this fund raiser comes under the control of the Board of Education that there will certainly be rules and guidelines about what can be performed.

Mr. Pelaia stated that today was the filing deadline for the Board of Education Candidates and Agnes Roncaglio chosen not to seek re-election. He praised and commended her for her dedication to the Board.

A motion was made by Mr. Pelaia, seconded by Mr. Restaino, and unanimously approved by the Board to hire an assistant coach for the lacrosse program.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Board, on a motion made by Mr. Pelaia, seconded by Mrs. Roncaglio, the meeting adjourned at 9:50 p.m.
