STUDENT REPORT

Student Representative, Sherein Abdelhady, spoke about the activities that are taking place at Nutley High School.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Lazovick spoke about the academic calendar, professional and academic development, principal evaluations, technology and the school security plan.

BOARD SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mrs. Yeamans spoke about the refinancing of the 2003 and 2005 bonds and the savings of over \$1 million to the tax payers in debt service. She also addressed the findings in the June 30, 2012 audit.

PRESENTATIONS:

Ms. Villani, Mrs. Divilio and several coordinators gave a power-point presentation outlining the Middle School Program of Studies.

Mr. O'Dell gave a power-point presentation outlining the steps taken by the committee to choose the McREL Framework for the administrator evaluation process.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Ad Hoc Long Range Facility Committee – Trustee Danchak-Martin stated that the committee interviewed Ross Haber of Ross Haber Associates for the Long-Term District Planning Services pursuant to the RFP. A resolution appointing the firm is on tonight's agenda.

Academic Committee – Trustee Reid stated the committee spoke about the Program of Studies and course offerings, principal evaluation model, academic calendar and the literacy coach.

Administration Committee – Trustee Kucinski thanked the Academic Committee for their outstanding work. He stated the Administration Committee discussed policies, calendar, PSE&G initiative, substitute rates, security, personnel and Radcliffe School facilities.

Finance – President Kuchta stated the committee went over the audit report, bond refinancing, grant at Radcliffe School, liquid church agreement, agenda items and the budget for 2013-14.

Strategic Planning – Community Action Committee - Trustee Scalera

The group reviewed the Survey Monkey results and discussed the differences between community service and curriculum based service-learning projects. The group identified some of the stronger examples of service-learning projects which are already being implemented by our teachers and also discussed ways some of the existing community service activities lend themselves to service learning projects.

Community action team members presented examples of service learning projects, guides, tool kits, and rubrics from a variety of states including Maryland, New Jersey, and California. The commonalities and strengths of these existing models were identified. Eight districts throughout New Jersey were called and the group is awaiting the returned calls.

Strategic Planning – Character Committee - Trustee Flynn

The five-year goal provides that the students in the school district will assume responsibility for the integrity of the Nutley student population, demonstrating character by their actions in school and the community and through their own participation, monitoring of, and presentation on codes of honor. The administrative leaders of this committee (Mr. O'Dell, Mr. Ackerman, Mr. Jones) met with Trustee Flynn to discuss the Year One Goal of conducting a program review of the curriculum in preparation of drafting an ethics curriculum for the district. Last week, the committee met as a whole to discuss the goals of the committee and next steps.

Trustee Flynn also reported that she attended the first meeting of the Mathematics Pilot Committee on December 12, 2012. At this meeting, representatives from McGraw-Hill and Singapore Math were present. Trustee Flynn expressed that the Board is focused upon building the budget so that it may obtain the best learning materials for the students, and that the products being proposed were extraordinary in the ways in which they support student learning and instruction (by incorporation of technological support for use at home and in school). The Pilot Committee will meet again in January to evaluate other products to determine which math series will be piloted in the district in this school year.

Strategic Planning – Communication Committee – Trustee Sherman

The Communications Committee will determine community needs and usage in relation to the various communication tools available to the district, including Naviance, School Messenger, Realtime portals, and District Web interface and determine what the information needs of the community are. The Committee will utilize surveys and focus group discussion with all stakeholder groups to gather data. Upon reviewing the qualitative and quantitative data the group will provide recommendations to the Board of Education as to the best use for each mode of communication. The committee also discussed and prepared an initial survey to be used in order to gather feedback on the current methods of communication in the district. It was ultimately decided to hold off implementation of the survey until further discussions were held with other strategic planning committees regarding their inclusion into the survey. For next month's meeting, the committee will continue the discussion on sharing the initial survey with other groups, outreach, and years 2 through 5 goals.

21. Amend Federal Budget Control Act of 2011

WHEREAS, a world class public education is essential for the future success of our nation and today's schoolchildren; and

WHEREAS, the Budget Control Act of 2011 includes a provision to impose \$1.2 trillion in across-the-board budget cuts in almost all federal programs, including education, that would become effective January 2, 2013; and

WHEREAS, these across-the-board budget cuts, also known as "sequestration," would have a negative impact on education through a reduction in funds of 7.8 percent or more and could result in larger class sizes, fewer course offerings, possible four-day school weeks, loss of extracurricular activities, and teacher and staff lay-offs; and

WHEREAS, sequestration would affect almost every public school system in the nation and the millions of students educated through programs such as Title I grants for disadvantaged students, the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), English Language Acquisition, Career and Technical Education, and 21st Century Community Learning Centers; and

WHEREAS, public schools nationwide would be negatively affected by an estimated \$2.7 billion loss in just three programs alone – Title I grants, IDEA special education state grants and Head Start – that serve a combined total of 30.7 million children; and

WHEREAS, federal funding for K-12 programs was already reduced by more than \$835 million in Fiscal Year 2011; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey already ranks last among the states in the percentage of school expenditures (3.1%) supported by the federal government; and

WHEREAS, in Fiscal Year 2013, New Jersey will lose more than \$73 million in funding for elementary and secondary education programs, administered through the U.S. Department of Education, as well as over \$11.7 million in Head Start funding; and

WHEREAS, with a state-imposed tax levy cap and limited growth in state aid, New Jersey local school districts have limited capacity to absorb cuts in funding resulting from sequestration.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Nutley Board of Education, in the County of Essex, State of New Jersey urges Congress and the Administration to amend the Budget Control Act to mitigate the drastic cuts to education that would affect our students and communities, and to protect education as an investment critical to economic stability and American competitiveness.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be sent to United States Senator Robert Menendez, United States Senator Frank Lautenberg, U.S. Representative Bill Pascrell, State Senator Paul Sarlo, Assembly Representative Rodney Frelinghuysen, the New Jersey School Boards Association, and the National School Boards Association.
