Trustee Scalera thanked members of the Ad Hoc committee.

President Kucinski thanked the Committee for all their efforts.

Upon a roll call vote the following resolution was unanimously approved.

WHEREAS, a prerequisite for effective learning and student academic success is a safe and secure school environment; and,

WHEREAS, violence poses a direct and material threat to the safety of our children and their ability to succeed academically; and,

WHEREAS, other school districts in this country have been subject to horrific acts of violence, resulting in the injury and death of children, adolescents and school staff; and,

WHEREAS, tragedies such as those in West Paducah, Kentucky, at Columbine High School in Colorado and most recently in Newtown, Connecticut underscore the need for meaningful action to address access to our schools and security; and,

WHEREAS, schools are actively engaged in the development of security plans in an attempt to prevent any similar tragedies; and,

WHEREAS, presently, the schools in the Nutley Public School District are utilized as polling locations for elections, which diminishes the safety of students within those buildings, requiring the school district to either close schools on days of elections or incur substantial costs associated with increasing security on election days; and,

WHEREAS the use of the school buildings for public elections causes a financial burden to the school district and substantial disruption to instruction; and,

WHEREAS the Nutley Board of Education is committed to removing the polling locations from its schools; and

IT IS, on this 29th day of July, 2013, hereby resolved, that the Nutley Board of Education requests that our State's leaders identify and implement meaningful actions to relocate polling locations within school districts in furtherance of school safety goals; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the polling locations continue to be located within school buildings, school districts should be reimbursed for the cost of security measures, as permitted by N.J.S.A. 19:8-2; and
