-Asked for each board member to give their own opinion on the security issue.

-A protest will take place on March 24, 2018 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. outside NHS to "Protect Our Children."

-Several residents spoke about the urgency of having armed guards in every school. -Favor the idea of working with Homeland Security. -When will the security assessment be done and will it be made public?

-Why are the police not at Lincoln School during drop-off and pick-up? -Concerned about the classroom door locks at Lincoln School.

-Clarification on fingerprinting for volunteers in the schools.

-The need for more security on how the doors are answered at the schools.

-Suggested quick fixes and several safety products on the market.

-Walkie-Talkie's for the After Care Program. -The security in neighboring districts. -Questioned the security of the street level windows at Radcliffe School.

-The board's high legal fees could support armed guards if the board hired different legal representation.

-Several residents are not in favor of armed guards in each school. -What is being done regarding mental health?
