A Letter to the People of Nutley

Dear Nutley Citizen:

The proposed budget for the operation of the Nutley Public Schools for the 1986-87 year is presented below in summary form, together with a comparison with the previous budget.

Please note that the portion of the budget on which you will be asked to vote is Current Expense, which shows an increase of 4.4%. The total budget is up 4.8%.

Inside the brochure are some questions which are often asked during budget time, together with answers. At the bottom of the page is a table showing how the school budget will affect your taxes. This should certainly be of interest to everyone. The pictures show some of your children in some of the activities which your taxes are helping to support.

It is admittedly impossible to adequately deal with all the details of a complex budget in the limited space of this brochure. We therefore urge you to pick up a budget book at your nearest school office or at the Board Offices, 375 Bloomfield Avenue. Any questions you have can be answered by any Board member or by the administrative staff at the Board Office.

....Questions and Answers

About Your Schools and The Budget

- Q. On what will the community be asked to vote on April 15?
- A. On the amount of local taxes necessary to support the Board of Education's 1986-87 Current Expense budget of \$16,293,231. This amount is calculated to be \$13,335,064.
- *Q.* Where will the rest of the money come from?
- A. Mostly from the State. Even though our State Aid was recently cut by 14%, it still represents the largest source of revenue other than local taxes. Other sources are appropriations from surplus, revenue from tuition, and interest income.
- Q. How is the schools' tax dollar spent?
- A. 68¢ out of every school tax dollar goes to Salaries. Another 22¢ pays for Utilities, Maintenance, Fixed Charges, Special State-Mandated Projects, Tuition, and Debt Service. The remaining 10¢ buys all the books, audiovisual materials, supplies (teaching and custodial), transportation, equipment, athletic program, professional services, auxiliary services, and miscellaneous expenses.

- Q. What is next year's budget cap?
- A. For 1986-87, the Current Expense budget cap as established by the State is 9.2%. Nutley's Current Expense budget for 1986-87 is 4.4% above last year's.
- Q. How much of my property tax dollar goes for education?
- A. Last year it was 43.6¢. In the last twenty years, this figure has been between 41¢ and 47¢.
- Q. How do school costs in Nutley compare with other school districts in Essex County?
- A. For many years, Nutley's cost per pupil was the lowest in the County. While this situation seemed fiscally attractive, quality education cannot, over the long run, be bought with the least dollars. We are still in the lowest third in Essex County, but four urban districts spend less per pupil.
- Q. How much will the proposed school budget cost me?
- A. Since this depends on the assessed valuation of your home, it varies. You can determine your cost in the table below.
